






## **Employment**



In the 2006 Census, there were 287 families in Meeniyan (Suburb), 134 Couple families with children, 120 Couple families without children, 30 One Parent families and 3 stated as other.

The median weekly individual income for a person aged 15 years and over who were usual residents was \$402, compared with \$466 in Australia. The median weekly household income was \$837, compared with \$1, 027 in Australia. The median weekly family income was \$1, 073 compared with \$1, 171 in Australia.

There were a total of 435 private dwellings counted in Meeniyan (Suburb) including 42 unoccupied private dwellings; 99.0% being separate houses and 1.0% were semi-detached, row or terrace houses, town houses with no flats, units or apartments or other dwellings. 286 of occupied private dwellings were family households and 92 Lone person household with 6 groups households.



South Gippsland has a thriving economy with over 7,000 businesses contributing to an annual output of over \$2.8 billion


South Gippsland has one of the lowest unemployment rates in Australia



Contained in the Plan is also a list of priority areas, which the Community believes should be focused on to fulfil the Vision. In addition, suggested actions plans, which may be undertaken to fulfil the Vision, are included.

Essentially, the Community Plan looks at what we value in Meeniyan and what we want it to become.

# Vision Statement

Meeniyan is committed to remaining a desirable and liveable town of quality that provides for the needs of all its residents and visitors whilst retaining the small town atmosphere and spirit

Meeniyan will continue to welcome new cultures and age groups, and to encourage opportunities for all people to fulfil their potential. This includes a commitment to encouraging opportunities for the young people in entertainment, education, employment and exercise. It will continue to support the cultural and artistic ambience of the community.

It will work to support the planned growth of the town, with a stronger commercial centre encouraging a relevant and suitable increase of necessary services and businesses to provide for the community.

# Purpose of Plan

The purpose of the Meeniyan Community Plan is to provide the opportunity for the Community to discuss and decide the future it sees for itself.

The plan will provide residents with certainty in regards to growth and development in the town, the types of services that can realistically be provided, the opportunities that are available now and in the future. It will set priorities in areas such as infrastructure, health, roads and the development of land.

This plan is owned by the community and will form the basis of discussion with other interested groups such as government and business in the future. It is not a static plan but an evolving one which will provide us with much needed direction into what is otherwise an uncertain future. It will be a way of mapping the future for ourselves and our children and hopefully set a good foundation for our grandchildren.

# **Community Planning Process**

## COMMUNITY PLAN DEVELOPMENT AND DISTRIBUTION - THE PROCESS

#### PROMOTION AND COMMUNICATION OF THE COMMUNITY PLAN PROCESS

### 1. Pre Community Promotion and Communication

The major objective of the Community Plan development process has been to ensure that all members of the community had the opportunity to contribute to the creation of the community plan for Meeniyan

The Integrated Community Plan development process for Meeniyan commenced with South Gippsland Shire Council Project Officers gathering all existing information, reports and previous community consultations that had occurred over the past 5 years. This information was then formed into a Community Plan Working Document and introduced at the Meeniyan Progress Association (MPA) meeting to invite the community to participate in the Integrated Community Planning process.

The MPA put forward their community to undergo the process as a partnership project with the South Gippsland Shire Council. Key representatives from the community were nominated to form a Community Planning Working Group to work with Project Officers throughout the process to ensure the Community Planning process met the individual needs of the community.

The process then included communication and involvement of the broad community of Meeniyan for the development of the Integrated Community Plan. This involved:

- Individual presentation by South Gippsland Shire Council to the Meeniyan community
- Establishment of a Community Planning Working Group
- Fortnightly Working Group Meetings over a 2 month period leading up to the Community Planning Workshop
- Fortnightly revised Working Document versions to reflect community consultation and feedback
- Advertising and promotion to the community for the Community Workshops through the delivery of notices to householders, community notices, newspaper articles and newspaper advertisements
- Distribution of final version Working Document to all Community Groups and Organisations and copies available from several local points
- All updated versions of the Working Document available on the Meeniyan website and distributed to all Working Group members
- Community workshop held and facilitated by the South Gippsland Shire Council to identify Priority Projects and Community Project Teams
- Youth specific engagement sessions and meetings
- Development of the Vision for Meeniyan and the Draft Meeniyan Community Plan
- Presentation of the Draft Meeniyan Community Plan to community members and other key stakeholders for comment
- Distribution of the finalised Meeniyan Community Plan

# **Community Planning Process**

### 2. Post Community Plan Promotion and Communication

Once the Draft Community Plan was developed, the plan was distributed to members of the community to allow for review and feedback. After an agreed review period any changes were incorporated and the finalised version of the Community Plan available to the broad community of Meeniyan.

### 3. Community Plan Distribution and Action

The completed Community Plan will be available for all members of the Meeniyan community. South Gippsland Shire Council is committed to support the community of Meeniyan and the project action teams to action their Priority Projects outlined in the Community Plan. The community will be regularly informed of progress in relation to the Community Plan.

### 4. Community Organisation and Working Group Team

The Community Plan process began with the presentation of the Integrated Community Planning Process to the Meeniyan community in November 2009, to confirm involvement of the Meeniyan community in the Integrated Community Planning project. The Community Planning Working Group was the contact organisation for the process. The Working Group consisted of 4 representatives from the community and South Gippsland Shire Council staff members. 

# **Community Planning Process**



Approximately 70 community members attended the Meeniyan Community Planning Workshop held on Saturday March 27th 2010. All previously identified community ideas collected during the consultation process of the community planning were on display during the workshop. Each community participant was given five dots to place next to the projects that they considered to be community priorities. All dots were then added and the projects receiving the most dots were identified as the priority projects. The results are as follows:




