Introduction

South Gippsland Shire Council budgeted \$400,000 each to the towns of Foster, Korumburra, Mirboo North and Venus Bay for the community to allocate towards capital works for the 2017/18 program.

Residents were asked to vote on ideas pulled from their community plan and the Long Term Capital Works Program or provide ideas of their own on the Community Capital Works Allocation forum specific to their town. oursay.org/southgippsland

Ideas that attracted a high amount of support online informed four community workshops hosted in each town in October/November 2016. This report consolidates the data provided in the online forums and the verbatim community reports written by residents at the workshops.


Engagement Process

Below is a data summary of the Venus Bay Community Capital Works Allocation forum once voting had closed. oursay.org/southgippsland/korumburra


Online Forum Statistics

All recommendations include notes written directly by the community at their workshop:

Recreation Reserve

Korumburra Soccer Club/Cricket club grounds could do with some much needed funds to turn the grounds into a safer area. This oval is in much need of some funding for the many people who use it. Additionally the lighting should be upgraded to ensure safe landings for the air ambulance who use this on regular occasions. Public toilets at the oval are also required as this is the only facility in town that does not provide toilets for people who use the facility 24/7.


Recreation Centre

Secondary School Link

Utilise the \$400,000 allocated as seed funding to install a safe walking/bike link to Korumburra Secondary School from the town centre.



Community Recommendation

Participants recommended that \$175,000 is allocated to the Korumburra Recreation Centre, \$175,000 to upgrades at the Korumburra Recreation Reserve, \$25,000 to begin a skate park/ youth hub and \$25,000 to picnic zones including a rotunda with BBQ facilities at the west entrance to Korumburra.


