



The Seekers to entertain Seniors

One of the founding members of Australia's first 'super group' will be heading up a free concert in Korumburra next week to celebrate the 33rd Victorian Seniors Festival.

Council is supporting the free festival that will see Athol Guy and his friends on stage for an hour show featuring unique and rarely seen footage of The Seekers, as well as live performances of their biggest hits.

Athol Guy - The Seekers Story is a musical and visual spectacular that takes the audience on a journey from the 60s through to modern day. Athol is joined by an all-star cast in a show that marks the 50th anniversary of the well-known band.

The theme for this year's festival is 'Celebrating Communities' and Council's Coordinator Aged and Disability Services, Louise Brydon, said the Korumburra event was only one of a number of planned activities across the state.
