Project Background

In 2011 South Gippsland Shire Council, The Geoffrey Gardiner Foundation and GippsDairy formed a partnership to deliver a three year community strengthening project with 8 communities in the Lower Tarwin Valley district, Fish Creek, Meeniyan, Stony Creek, Buffalo, Dumbalk, Venus Bay, Tarwin Lower and Koonwarra.

The Lower Tarwin Valley Project is the pilot project for the Gardiner Foundation's Strengthening Small Dairy Communities and has been developed to work with small rural dairying communities in the Lower Tarwin Valley district of South Gippsland Shire.

Through the Lower Tarwin Valley - Strengthening Small Dairy Communities project members and groups have had the opportunity to participate in skills development, network building and community development including community planning and project development.

As part of the community planning process in December 2012 Koonwarra residents were invited to a Community Ideas Workshop at the Koonwarra Hall. Approximately 20 Koonwarra residents attended the workshop to participate in developing a shared Vision for Koonwarra and explore ideas for the community.

Ideas Bank

What follows is a list of ideas offered by Koonwarra residents based on what is important to the community, what the community likes about Koonwarra and what they would like Koonwarra to look like in the future. From the list of ideas workshop participants were asked to select 3 'achievable' projects as their first priority for development.

All ideas submitted by the community are acknowledged and remain in the *Ideas Bank* for future reference. Ideas can be 'withdrawn' from the bank at any time by community members interested in exploring an idea further and 'deposited' back in to the bank for future development.

The Koonwarra *Ideas Bank* is a record of what is valuable to a community and can be used as a guide to help direct community development.

About Koonwarra – A small town with a big heart

Koonwarra is in the heart of dairy country, nestled between the rolling hills of the Strezlecki Ranges, the ancient Bunurong Coast and the awe inspiring world heritage Wilsons Promontory. Visitors and residents can experience the region by travelling down the South Gippsland Highway, wandering along the Grand Ridge Road, surfing the Coastal Promontory beaches, riding the Great Southern Rail Trail and relaxing in our hospitality and natural abundance.

It is a picturesque Village with strong traditional community groups such as the CFA, Memorial Hall Committee and Recreation Reserve Committee which maintains this scenic reserve at a very high standard. Koonwarra is also well known for fine food and wine, contemporary arts and craft, innovative health and wellbeing services, a leader in promoting organic foods, plastic bag free, Australia's first Waste Wise Village in Victoria, the pilot for community domain names and Regional Farmers Markers and the Slow Food initiatives were conceived here and have spread to other areas.

About the Process:

Ideas Workshop

On December 5, 2012 more than 20 local residents attended the Koonwarra Ideas Dinner Workshop at the Koonwarra Hall. The evening was beautifully catered by the Koonwarra Store and facilitated by the Lower Tarwin Valley Project Facilitator, Marzia Maurilli and the Community Strengthening Officer, Barbara Look, from South Gippsland Shire Council.

Koonwarra residents were given several opportunities to submit project ideas prior to the workshop if unable to attend. All suggestions and comments were collated by the project facilitator and presented at the workshop for consultation. Before submitting project ideas at the workshop participants were encouraged to explore and discuss strengths, opportunities and issues existing within the community to help form a shared vision for Koonwarra to guide future project development.

Workshop participants were encouraged to refer back to their Vision when submitting project ideas and when later asked to select 3 achievable projects as their first priorities.

IDEAS BANK

Workshop participants were asked for project ideas that reflected and supported the Koonwarra Vision Statement developed earlier during the workshop. Participants were encouraged to envisage how they would like Koonwarra to look in the future and to think about existing assets that could have added value by further development or improvement.

Ideas with a common theme were grouped together under one category. For example project ideas relating to walking paths and trails were grouped together under a *Pathways Strategy*. Similarly several project ideas were grouped together under *Webpage Development*.

What follows below is a list of all the ideas submitted for the workshop with the number of votes received.

Priority Projects

Once all ideas were explored workshop participants were asked to select from the list of ideas *three* projects as their priority. Project selection was determined via one vote per person (*see above table*). Participants were reminded to refer back to the *Vision Statement* when voting for their preferred project and very importantly to use their vote for what could be realistically achieved, taking in to consideration overall value/benefit of the project to the community and effort required such as dollars, time, people power and resources. Participants were then asked to volunteer/nominate one community representative for each of the three projects as the key contact person for that particular project.

The LTV Project Facilitator will work with each project contact person to help further develop project ideas.

Conclusion

The three priority projects selected by the Koonwarra community at the Community Ideas Workshop are;

- the Koonwarra Pathway Strategy
- Nirvana Park and
- the Koonwarra Farmers Market.
 - o Koonwarra Webpage redevelopment

The Koonwarra website project, although included in the list did not vote as highly as the three other projects. This project was included in the priority listed projects because one community member was particularly interested in working on the redevelopment of the Koonwarra website.

Koonwarra Pathway Strategy: The Koonwarra Pathway Strategy project scored the highest with 9 notes overall. This project reflects the community's vision for a vibrant, social village that promotes spiritual, physical and environmental health and wellbeing by connecting art, food and people with path ways, trails and outdoor opportunities. Participants described a European style village with connecting paths that lead to a central outdoor community meeting place. Seating, signposts, art sculptures and safe crossing paths are some of the individual ideas suggested as part of the strategy. It is envisaged that this type of infrastructure will help promote social interaction, health and well-being and promote and highlight local art and produce. The LTV Project facilitator will convene a meeting with the project contact person, Jol Dutton early 2013 to discuss actions for further project development.

Nirvana Park: Nirvana Park has long been an issue amongst the Koonwarra community ever since its original owner Mrs Dellabosco bequeathed it to Council. Since then the community feels that the area, once beautifully maintained by Mrs Dellabosco, is now neglected, an eyesore and a possible fire risk. The community would like to see this area either, better maintained, developed or even sold with the proceeds, or part of, going back into the community for project implementation. The LTV Project facilitator met with the project contact person, Don Cook, in January 2013 to discuss in more detail project development. The next step is to hold a community consultation meeting to discuss possible options for Nirvana park and gauge the community's preference for the area.

Koonwarra Farmers Market: The Koonwarra Farmers Market was the first Farmers Market in South Gippsland and has grown to be one of the largest markets in the Shire. The market is held the first Saturday of every month and attracts hundreds of locals and visitors with over 100 stalls selling fresh produce and local art and craft. The Koonwarra Farmers Market Committee is keen to implement improved infrastructure that will provide better access to the existing facilities and create better links with other existing businesses and activities in Koonwarra. The LTV Project Facilitator will meet with the contact person, Susan Neville, to discuss grant funding opportunities.


