




# Proposed New Road Name for unnamed Road off Caithness Road- Koonwarra

South Gippsland Shire Council is proposing to name a road in the locality of Koonwarra. The location and extent of the road proposed to be named is detailed below;

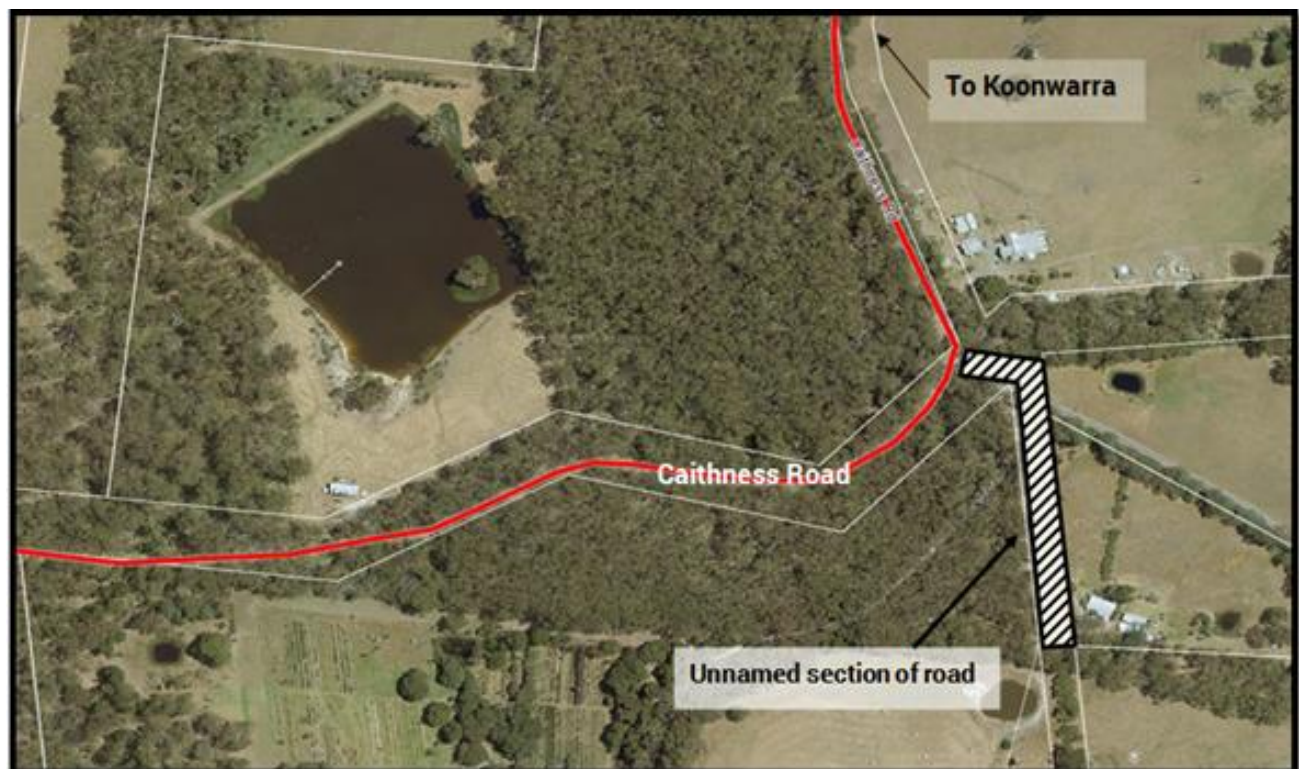
This unnamed road runs to the south/east off Caithness Road, Koonwarra for approximately 220 metres - shown as  in **Figure 1**.

The proposed names put forward to Council are as follows;

**“DARSHAN” | “BARGUSS” | “MILLSOM”**

## ORIGIN OF ROAD NAMES

---

### *Darshan*

---

As put forward by the property owner, Darshan means 'to receive from, to receive uplifting glances and blessings from one who is in tune with nature.' There is a Conservation Covenant on the bushland to the right of the road.

---

### *Barguss*

---

Robert Barguss died of illness as a POW on the Burma Railway on 12 January 1944. Robert was from Koonwarra and has his name etched on the memorial gates in his honour in Koonwarra township. [Proposed by Leongatha & District Historical Society]

### *Millsom*

---

Harry Millsom was in 2/22 Battalion at Rabaul and was executed by the Japanese as a POW on 8 March 1942. Harry lived and farmed at Tarwin and also has his name etched on the memorial gates in his honour in Koonwarra Township. [Proposed by Leongatha & District Historical Society]
