

Social Community Infrastructure Blueprint Progresses

South Gippsland Shire Council noted progress of the Social Community Infrastructure Blueprint 2014-2029 at its Council meeting.

The blueprint ensures that services and the associated infrastructure are planned and ready for future business and population growth. Of the nineteen community facility actions identified in the blueprint nine are ongoing, four are underway and one has been completed with five yet to commence.

The demographic data in the blueprint will be updated and additional focus areas will be included such as the Early Years Services Infrastructure Strategy before it is published to Council's website.

Community facility actions will be reviewed annually as part of the budgeting process for Council's forward 15 year Capital Works Program and when potential grant funding becomes available.

South Gippsland Shire Mayor Councillor Lorraine Brunt was pleased to see the progression of the blueprint.

"The Social Community Infrastructure Blueprint is a key document that outlines South Gippsland's need for infrastructure such as multipurpose facilities, libraries, youth activity areas, and paths and trails.

"It is fantastic to see that as we progress toward 2029 we have been actively seeking how to improve or provide the identified necessary community infrastructure.

"I hope that the four actions currently underway will be delivered in the near future so that residents will have access to such vital community assets," said the Mayor.
