

Council Adopts 2018/19 Annual Budget

South Gippsland Shire Council adopted the 2018/19 Annual Budget at its meeting this week after months of deliberation.

Final projections for next financial year are now complete, resulting in a total budgeted expenditure of \$63.2 million with expenditure on a capital works program of \$23.4 million.

The 2018/19 Capital Works Program is \$0.7 million higher than allocated in 2017/18 and significantly higher than recent previous financial years.

Five written submissions were received and considered from the Proposed Budget in May as part of the budget exhibition process.

South Gippsland Shire Mayor Councillor Lorraine Brunt thanked the community for their feedback and all those who worked to produce the budget.

"Council is proud to have produced a budget that has a second capital works program worth over \$20 million during our term.

"This is a significant investment and we cannot wait to see what will be achieved over the next twelve months. In particular we are proud to fund the Bena Kongwak Bridge, Mirboo north Pool Refurbishment Design, Korumburra Community Hub Design, Lock Main Street Renewal and Toora Pool Masterplan.

"The budget deliberations have been a good opportunity to stop and reflect on our performance over the last year. At the end of the day we must continue to serve our community and I believe that this budget should do just that," said the Mayor.
