

Opportunities Available for Mirboo North L2P Program

The South Gippsland L2P Program currently has vacancies in Mirboo North and South Gippsland Shire Council is encouraging eligible young people to apply.

The program helps drivers gain the skills and experience they need to obtain their probationary licence and aims to assist those who may find it hard to find someone to help them achieve 120 hours driving experience.

Council is fortunate to have a vehicle for Mirboo North that was secured through community funding. The vehicle has helped 35 learners gain 1096 volunteer driving hours in the last twelve months alone, with two learners turning 18 years old and gaining their licence.

The Victorian Government has recently increased funding for the program and Council is encouraging community members to spread the word about current availability.

South Gippsland Shire Council's Community Strengthening Project Officer Denise Trani was encouraging eligible young people to make an application to the program.

"It's been two years since the South Gippsland L2P Program secured a new vehicle via an incredibly generous donation of funds and time by the Mirboo North community.

"We currently have open opportunities for the program in Mirboo North and would encourage young people needing assistance to apply so they can use this necessary asset," said Ms Trani.
