South Gippsland Shire Council is inviting all bike riders to participate in the largest road safety mapping program for cyclists and other road users in South Gippsland.

A community engagement website has been developed that will allow users to identify road safety issues that need improvement on a map and also provide positive feedback for good cycling connections.
