

Education

If you happen to live in Korumburra and need education – then you are in luck. As well as boasting its own high-quality educational institutions, Korumburra is just a short drive away from many other educational possibilities.



Korumburra is home to the government-owned Korumburra Primary School and Korumburra Secondary College, as well as St. Joseph's Catholic Primary School. Korumburra also has a kindergarten and child care centre.

Apprenticeships Group Australia (formerly Gippsland Group Training and Apprenticeships Victoria) is located in Korumburra's industrial precinct and provides high-quality industry-based training for apprentices. A not-for-profit registered training organisation, Apprenticeships Group Australia allows apprentices to gain nationally recognised trade based qualifications in a hands-on, practical environment.

The nearby town of Leongatha is home to campuses of **GippsTAFE** and **Education Centre Gippsland (ECG)**, providing Korumburra residents with even more learning options.

Just over an hour's drive from Korumburra are **Monash University's Gippsland** and **Berwick** campuses, located in Churchill and Berwick, respectively. The close proximity of these high-quality universities means that budding Korumburra university scholars need not relocate to suburban Melbourne to pursue their dreams of higher education.

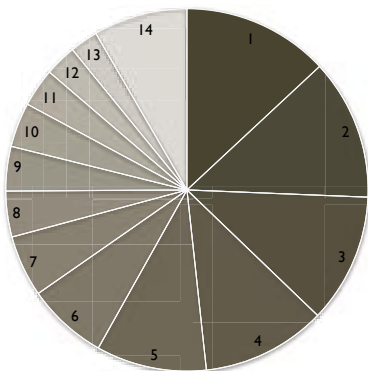

Real Estate

Korumburra is a great place to live. The relaxed atmosphere and picturesque countryside, combined with a wealth of opportunities, make Korumburra a fantastic place to bring up a family. Just 90 minutes from Melbourne, Korumburra is not too far away, but still manages to have a true country atmosphere.

Korumburra has low unemployment and high industry productivity. This equates to good job prospects for residents and contributes towards a vibrant and active community. Korumburra's key industries include agriculture, manufacturing, retail, education, health care and tourism.

Recent changes to the planning scheme introduced to protect the region's agricultural base (Amendment C51) have made the development of new dwellings on vacant rural land (Farming Zone) more restrictive. Potential purchasers of vacant Farming Zone land are strongly encouraged to contact Council before purchasing land with the intention to construct a dwelling or undertake a commercial operation.

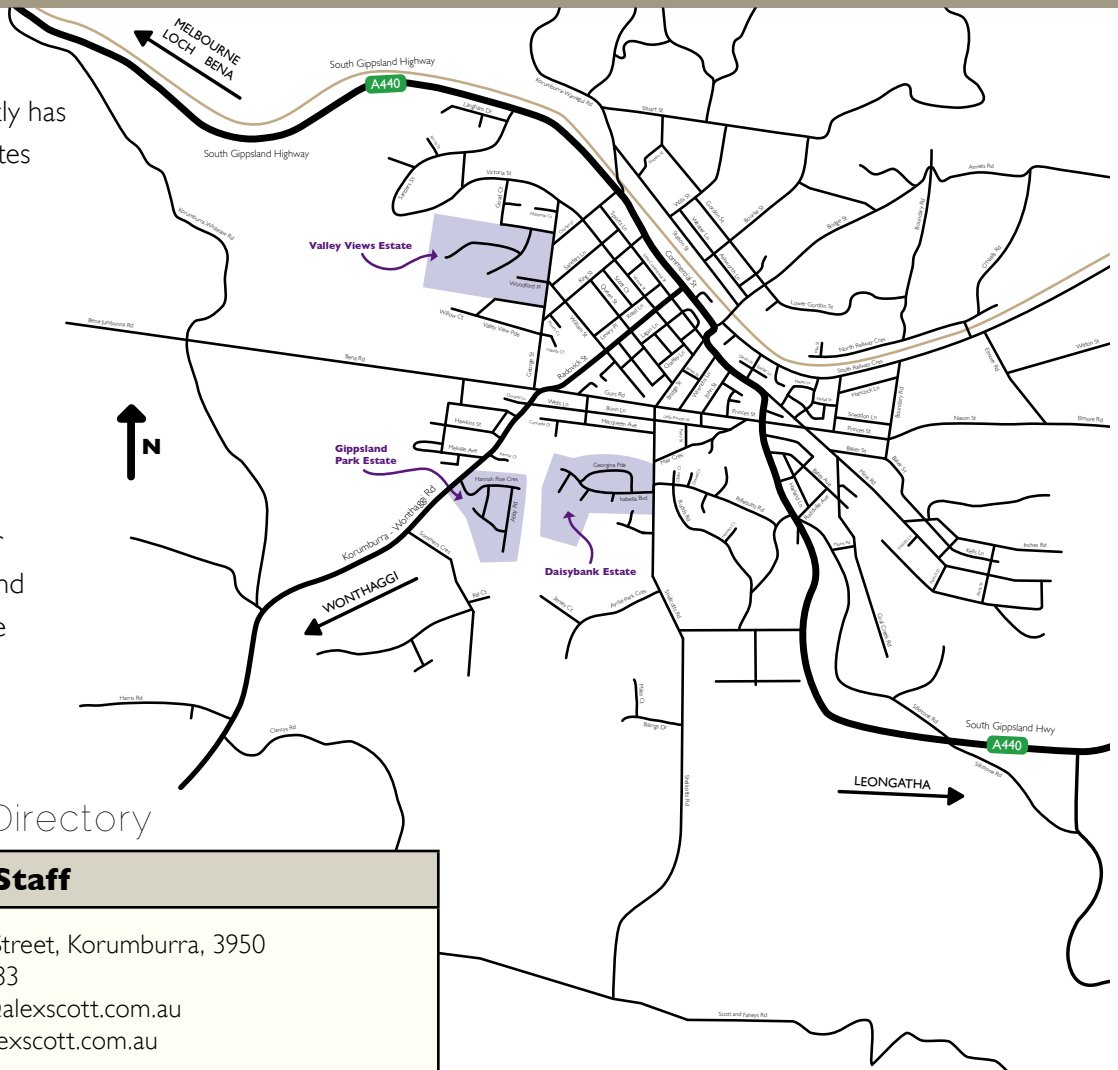

Real Estate

Health Care Services

Korumburra has a hospital. That's big news for many country towns, and it means that living in Korumburra doesn't mean sacrificing essential health services. Korumburra's hospital is part of the Gippsland Southern Health Service and provides many services.

The closest referral hospitals are West Gippsland Hospital (Warragul) and Latrobe Regional Hospital (Traralgon). Leongatha and Warragul hospitals are located 15km and 42km from Korumburra, respectively.



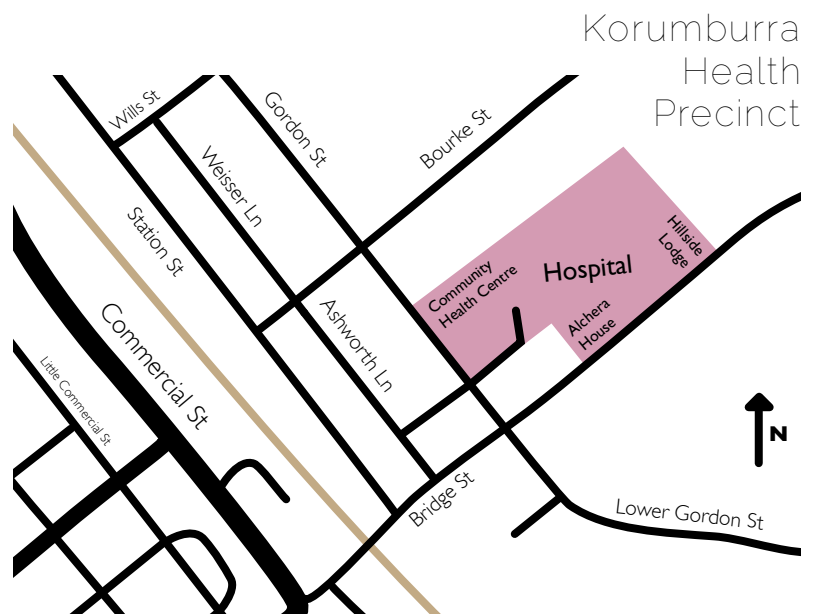
Residential Care

Korumburra has three residential care establishments, **Alchera House**, **Hillside Lodge** and **Carinya Lodge Hostel**.

Alchera House is a high care residential nursing home with 20 beds, catering to the most infirm of patients.

Carinya Lodge Hostel is a low care residential home with 41 regular beds and 2 respite beds to enable carers to take a break from their constant caring duties.

Located behind the Korumburra Hospital, Hillside Lodge is also a low care residential home. Hillside Lodge has 28 regular beds and 2 respite beds.



Health, Aged and Child Care

Child Care

The Birralee Child Care Centre is a high quality establishment catering to the long day care needs of local families.

With friendly, caring staff, Birralee places an emphasis on child development and well-being. Child care services are available for children aged 0-12 years.



Maternal & Child Health Care

A maternal and child health care nurse provides new mothers with advice regarding breast-feeding, immunization, nutrition, family planning and child development. A friendly immunisation team facilitates a vaccination program throughout the South Gippsland Shire at various locations.

Korumburra Senior Citizen's Centre

The Korumburra Senior Citizen's Centre, located at the corner of Radovick and Victoria streets, is a meeting place for people over the age of 55. With various weekly activities and special events, the centre is a great place to make or meet friends.

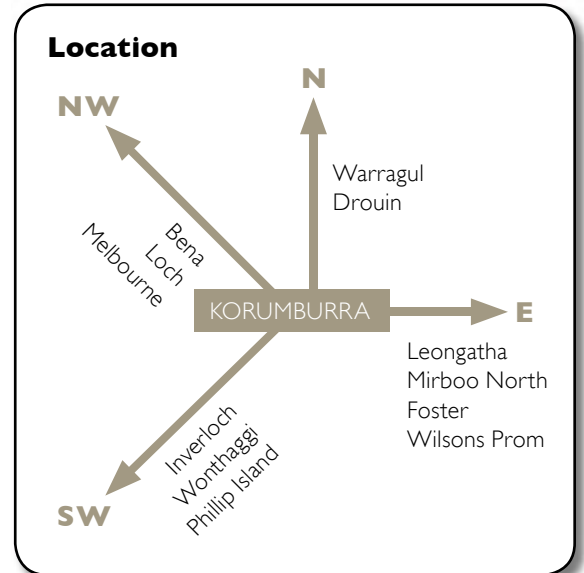

Transport

Korumburra is centrally located within South Gippsland. With the large towns of Leongatha and Wonthaggi being just 15 and 25 minutes away via well maintained roads, Korumburra is well within reach of the Melbourne CBD, whilst retaining its country atmosphere.

V-Line Bus Services

The Yarram-Melbourne V-Line bus service regularly stops at Korumburra, providing a convenient way to travel to the heart of Melbourne. With eight Melbourne-bound services on weekdays and four on weekends, Korumburra residents need not worry if they do not own a car.

V-Line buses stop in Commercial Street and on the South Gippsland Highway near Coal Creek. Buses generally travel all the way to Melbourne's Southern Cross Station, with an optional connection to the metropolitan train network at Dandenong Station.

Transport

Train Connections

The closest active train station to Korumburra is located in Warragul, just over 30 minutes away by car. Warragul Station is a V-Line train station that is serviced by around 40 trains per day, many of which travel all the way between Traralgon and Melbourne's Southern Cross Station.

Alternative Transport

Council Services

The South Gippsland Shire Council provides a number of services for local residents. These include aged, disability, health, welfare and youth services.

Health & Community Care

South Gippsland Shire Council's Home and Community Care program provides a range of services to assist people with a disability and the elderly. Services are designed to provide support to enable people to live independently at home for as long as possible. Eligibility for services is determined by Council Assessment Officers.

Home maintenance tasks include:

- Installation of safety rails and small ramps
- Cleaning of spouting (safety guidelines apply)
- Replacement of light-bulbs
- Minor tree lopping
- Repairs to locks, handles and doors
- Loose floorboards

Personal care services include:

- Bathing
- Grooming
- Dressing
- Toileting
- Shopping
- Banking

Meals on Wheels

A meals on wheels service is provided by the South Gippsland Shire Council for elderly or incapacitated residents. A team of volunteers delivers the meals, which can be hot, cold or frozen. Meals can cater for special dietary requirements (e.g. low-cholesterol or diabetic) and are nutritionally prepared.

Respite Care

Respite services provide the carers of frail older people, and people of any age with a disability, a break from their caring responsibilities.



Youth Services

The South Gippsland Shire Council provides a number of services to help engage, inspire and motivate young people. These include:

South Gippsland Youth Council

A Council comprising approximately 15 people aged between 12 and 25 years. The core function of the Youth Council is to help direct and develop youth activity in South Gippsland. Examples of Youth Council activities include running youth projects, assessing and making decisions on grant applications, and participating in team-building and leadership programs.

FReeZa

FReeZa events are live music and dance parties hosted in a drug and alcohol-free, supervised, safe and secure environment. FReeZa events are planned, developed and managed by young people for young people in conjunction with Kilmany Uniting Care. The events are aimed towards 14-18 year-olds.



Council Services

Economic Development

The Economic Development department provides support and investment advice for prospective and established businesses. Workshops and events are held regularly, providing helpful information and professional development for employers and employees.

The Business Development team is keen to provide assistance to potential investors, developers and businesses in identifying or capitalising on regional opportunities.
