# Prescribed Accommodation Guide



Prescribed accommodation are types of accommodation which require registration with their local Council and inspection to ensure public health standards are being met.

This is intended to reduce the chance of disease transmission through the use of short term accommodation, providing peace of mind for holiday makers and other users of these types of accommodation.

#### **Prescribed Accommodation**

- Hotels and motels
- Hostels
- Student dormitories
- Holiday camps
- Rooming houses
- Any type of dwelling where six or more guests can be accommodated (excluding family of the owner/ occupier) and the property can be occupied by more than one group

#### **Examples**



A bed and breakfast where the owner/occupier retains use of the property and rents out rooms/ parts of the property allowing three couples to stay (total six guests)

## Not Prescribed Accommodation


- A vessel, vehicle, tent or caravan
- Premises in which no more than five guests can be accommodated (excluding family of the occupier)
- A house or self-contained flat under exclusive use of the occupier, this may be the owner or a person using the accommodation on a short term or holiday lease

### Examples



Holiday houses or self-contained units which are only leased as a whole property





Single properties with two self-contained holiday cabins which together accommodate six or more guests

Single properties with two self-contained holiday cabins that are on their own titles.
