

Korumburra Hub Update: Last Chance to Suggest a Name and VCAT Matter Settled

Council would like to remind interested community members that there are just three more days to suggest an official name for the 'Korumburra Hub'.

Names can be related to Korumburra, its people and culture, Indigenous heritage, local flora and fauna or contributions to wars in which Australian has been involved. It could be something as simple as the current temporary name.

Submitted names will be evaluated against naming criteria and will then be shortlisted with assistance from the Korumburra Round Table. After the shortlist has been developed, the names will go out for a public vote to decide the name that will be officially adopted.

The new hub will be home to the library, Milpara Community House and other community groups. Name suggestions can be registered at: www.southgippsland.vic.gov.au/naming
Name ideas must be submitted by this Friday, 2 April.

Council received notification yesterday that the VCAT matter related to the Hub has been settled. The path is now clear for the project to proceed. It is expected that the amended planning permit – which will address the height of the fence adjoining the neighbour's property; disabled car parking spaces; and comparison of the natural ground level with finished building floor levels – will be issued in the next few days.
