

Revised Procurement Policy Adopted

South Gippsland Shire Council adopted the revised Procurement Policy at its meeting yesterday.

The updated policy was required to meet the requirements of the *Local Government Act 2020* and incorporate continuous improvements.

The policy provides objectives and requirements for Council procurement ensuring goods and services purchased for Council represent good value for money, consider procurement risk and a thorough procurement process proportionate with the purchase value.

Revisions made to the Policy to meet these requirements include:

- Aligning the policy objectives
- Nominating a public tendering threshold (\$250,000) given the removal of a threshold provided in the previous Local Government Act 1989
- Including a mechanism for seeking collaboration with other Councils and government bodies based on value for money
- Realignment to the Local Government Act 2020 clause changes and renumbering
- Adding the ability (with approval) to sole source justifiable procurements
- Providing guidance on considerations for value for money
- Ability to utilise period based and blanket based procurement where it provides greater efficiency and compliance
- Ability to accept vendor provider terms and conditions
- Inclusion of the requirement to comply with the Victorian Competitive Neutrality Policy
