Administrators' Message



Despite recent lockdowns and restrictions, the Community Leadership Program has been running very smoothly. The first session – Getting to Know South Gippsland – was delivered online with Council's CEO Kerryn Ellis and other key Council staff to provide an overview of the South Gippsland region and insights into the breadth of work undertaken by Council.

As the program rolls on, sessions are planned to rotate around the region. The second session was held in person in Tarwin Lower where the group explored values and teamwork. There was a lot of reflection on how participants factor these into leading their various work and community activities. It was a sunny day that provided the opportunity to do some activities outside, something that was very well received by participants.

This week's session – Local Government 101 – which aims to support participants to understand the different roles within Council, will be delivered online. However, there is hope that the next session on Board and Committee Governance can go ahead in person.

Over the past few weeks, we have released four podcasts that tell the story of some of our inspiring community members. The Our People Podcasts series was developed by Council staff with the help of Jet Streamer who recorded the podcasts and a number of local photographers to help you see the faces behind the microphone. These podcasts have been created with potential new residents in mind, giving them the opportunity to hear directly from residents what they love about living, working and thriving in South Gippsland. However, we believe there is also a benefit for existing residents, who can get to know others in their community and feel proud of the community they are part of. So far in the series we have heard from local farmers, an artist, a chef and a small business owner – and there is still two more to come. We have also become aware that some community members are concerned about Council staff remuneration amounts in the 2021/22 Budget. In the 2021/22 Budget, there is an increase of 8.2 full time equivalent staff compared to the forecast for 2020/21. This increase is predominantly due to the addition of seven positions, all of which are contracted fixed-term roles. These positions are for the delivery of capital works or other projects that are mainly grant funded. If an employee has been hired specifically for the fulfillment of a specific project, their salary is included in the project cost and since they are grant funded projects, the salary is also grant funded.

This week, we heard the story of Megan, a kindergarten teacher who moved from St Kilda to Fish Creek to enrich our young people's lives. She has been a great addition to the team and has shared her story about her relocation to South Gippsland to teach kindergarten.
