At our Council Meeting in October 2020, we endorsed a business case for an addition to the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program by Australian Volunteer Coast Guard Association (AVCGA) – Port Welshpool Flotilla. The Port Welshpool Marine Search and Rescue Hub project involved the demolition of the existing buildings and the construction of new, modern, purpose-built infrastructure including a kit-based building and adjacent storage shed. This project has now been completed – an amazing result for our community.

This project is a terrific example of Council working in partnership with a key community organisation in the Coast Guard, and we are delighted to see this project come to fruition.

We wish to thank the Australian Volunteer Coast Guard Association – Port Welshpool Flotilla for their hard work in getting this project completed so promptly in what has been a rather tumultuous time, due to the COVID-19 pandemic and the restrictions that go with that. These developments ensure the safety of those who want to get out on the water when we can.

This week has not seen a lot of great news from a COVID-19 restrictions perspective. While there was something immediately positive in there for families that playgrounds will reopen and in-home childcare can resume for authorised workers, there is hope that regional Victorians will be given some freedoms in the coming week which will be announced when the Premier receives the relevant advice.
