## Administrators' Message



At this week's Council Meeting, we adopted our Administrator Community Update which encompassed much of what we have achieved over our term. If anyone told us at the start of our term that we would be leading an organisation and community through a one in 100-year pandemic, we would not have believed them. However, this has been our reality and a great challenge to continue to provide the services and work that the community expect.

We have reflected on the change we have seen in both the community and within the organisation during our time in South Gippsland. The shift in confidence in Council in the community has allowed for partnerships on projects to thrive. Projects such as the Mirboo North Pool, Great Southern Rail Trail, Foster Indoor Stadium redevelopment, the suite of projects to revitalise Korumburra and the renewal of Bair Street in Leongatha have been underpinned by collaboration between Council and community. We feel the community has welcomed this approach, which is echoed by the extensive support they have shown us.

We have been able to achieve so much in our two years, which is a testament to the Council staff who have supported us from day one and so eager to serve their community. They truly are passionate about this region and are an asset to the incoming Council.

While our update does not cover everything we have had a hand in, that does not mean that nothing has been happening in our villages. Every corner of our region has seen investment and that is something we are immensely proud of.

The Yanakie and Long Jetty Caravan Parks were also part of this month's agenda. We endorsed a proposed timeline for their transition that will involve 21-year leases commencing from 1 July 2022, after draft leases and tender documents have been finalised. It has been a tough year for them with the pandemic, but we have tremendous faith that they will be a valued part of the broader South Gippsland tourism umbrella.

Administrator Brown updated us on a new program by MyLi Community Library. The 'Books By Us' program will teach students all about how books are made at real publishing houses, from writing and editing to illustration, design and printing. At the conclusion of the program, their books will be available at the library for users to borrow. With a waitlist of schools excited to trial this new program, it was wonderful to hear that Loch Primary School students will benefit from the program this year.
