At this month's Council Meeting, we had quite a varying agenda from arts to emergency management.

Council is looking for nominees for a new Arts Advisory Committee. The wet weather we've been having and will continue to face over the next few months has caused issues for our road network. There are potholes popping up and, in some areas, landslips have had a profound impact. Some of the roads that have been affected by landslips have reopened, but there is still lots of work to do before these roads are 100 per cent safe.
