## SOUTH GIPPSLAND SHIRE SUMMARY OF JOB VACANCIES

#### JULY 2015 - Overview

Nationally, the average total number of internet and newspaper job advertisements fell 0.44% in July. Internet job advertising fell 0.5% and newspaper job advertising rose 2.18% (seasonally adjusted).

Increases in the weekly average number of newspaper advertisements over last month were seen in The Australian Capital Territory (+32.55%), Queensland (+10.14%), Tasmania (+6.01%) and New South Wales (+4.98%). The largest fall was in South Australia (-9.16%) followed by the Northern Territory (-5.52%), Western Australia (-4.53%) and Victoria (-0.99%).<sup>1</sup>

The South Gippsland Shire Council recorded a total of 110 newspaper job vacancies in July; an average of 27.5 per week week.

The sector of *Health & Wellness* recorded the highest number of positions advertising 39% of newspaper vacancies in July, followed by *Administration & Support Services* (10%) and *Hospitality & Tourism* (8%).

For the study period January-July 2015 over January-July 2014 the South Gippsland Shire region recorded an increase of 1.43% in the average number of newspaper job advertisements; this compares with Victoria and Australia which recorded falls of 10.79% and 20.39% respectively over the same period (original numbers).

#### **METHODOLOGY**

The figures for July 2015 have been obtained from the local newspapers the "South Gippsland Sentinel – Times", "Great Southern Star", the "Foster Mirror" and the "Mirboo North Times" published in July. The "Sentinel" and the "Star" are published on Tuesdays or Wednesdays and the "Mirror" and "Mirboo North Times" on Wednesdays. Some of the job advertisements appear in one or more papers. As most job advertisements appear in the "Sentinel", any duplicate advertisements have been noted from the positions advertised in the other newspapers. amjproject statistical counts have been adjusted to remove duplications and repeat advertisements.

The "South Gippsland Sentinel – Times" covers South Gippsland Shire and the Bass Coast Shire and also receives job advertisements from other neighbouring Shires. Not all job locations are stated.

As some months may have five weeks of job advertisements one year and four in others, a straight comparison of monthly figures can be misleading. To clarify this, the average number of jobs per week within each month has been used where required.

The newspaper job advertisements counted have been sorted into seventeen (17) industry sectors in accordance with South Gippsland Shire Council requirements and are reported on a monthly basis.


#### HISTORICAL DATA

In the absence of similarly detailed historical data directly relevant to the South Gippsland Shire being available, the historic data used has been obtained from Gippsland Research and Information Service (GRIS) "Weekly Job Advertisements". It should be noted that these figures show the number of job advertisements placed, not the number of advertised jobs. Repeat advertisements would therefore be counted and advertisements with more than one position would not be reflected in these figures. **Caution should therefore be made when using the historical information**. Although the figures are not a direct comparison to those counted from both the local papers, it is possible to observe general trends.


It is not possible to obtain information on which job categories the positions relate from this historical information.

#### **JUNE 2015**





Where known, the following chart details which jobs were located in the South Gippsland Shire. Not all vacancies state their location and others are from neighbouring shires. All job advertisements have been included regardless of location, based on the premise that the region acts as a cohesive workforce and thus gives a more accurate picture of work opportunities for people living within South Gippsland Shire.

#### HISTORICAL DATA

As previously stated, in the absence of historical data directly relevant to the South Gippsland Shire being available, the historic data used has been obtained from Gippsland Research and Information Service (GRIS) "Weekly Job Advertisements" and partly amjproject estimates (September – December 2009). Where the figures from GRIS have been used it should be noted that these show the number of job advertisements placed, not the number of advertised jobs. Duplicates and repeat advertisements are also counted. **Caution should therefore be made when using this information**. Although the figures are not a direct comparison to those counted from the local papers, it is possible to observe general trends.

It is not possible to obtain information from the historical GRIS data on which job categories these positions relate from this information.
