Class 3A Food Premises FC3A	A food premises at which one or more of the following food handling activities occurs: 1. preparation and/or cooking of potentially hazardous foods which are served to guests for immediate consumption at an accommodation getaway premises; 2. food made using a hot-fill process resulting in a product such as chutney, relish, salsa, tomato sauce or any other similar food, that: (i) is made at home-based business or temporary food premises (e.g., a hired kitchen); and (ii) has been heat treated to a temperature of not less than 85°C and then filled and sealed hot into its packaging; and (iii) is acidic (pH of less than 4.6); and (iv) has salt or sugar or any other	\$336.40	\$231.00

Exemption of Community Not-for-profit Groups:

Council resolution exempts Community not-for profit groups (this does not include sporting clubs) from the requirement to pay Food Act registration fees subject to:

1. Raise funds only for not-for-profit purposes; and
2. Do not pay anyone specifically for the handling of food for sale; and
3. Do not receive State or Federal government funding
