The report highlights the complexity of attracting people to our region for work, including housing shortages and worker accommodation. This report will help inform ways Council can continue to support local industries.

At the September Council Meeting, the Coastal Strategy was adopted. This adopting of the report concludes the extensive process, which included multiple stages of community engagement.
