

16 Days of Activism in South Gippsland

The 2023 16 Days of Activism Against Gender-Based Violence has begun, with services and organisations across Gippsland getting involved in the Let's Chat Gippsland campaign to prevent gender-based violence.

Our community is not safe for everyone. Violence against women and girls is particularly widespread. The Let's Chat campaign aims to challenge the harmful attitudes that perpetuate and normalise gender-based violence as well as the breadth of the issue in our community.

From 25 November until 10 December, Gippslanders are encouraged to start a conversation, whether it be with their family, friends, colleagues, students or neighbours.
