Advocacy in Canberra

Last week, I travelled to Canberra with Deputy Mayor Councillor Gilligan, Councillor Hersey, Chief Executive Officer Allison Jones, and Tony Peterson Director Sustainable Infrastructure, to attend the Australian Local Government Assembly. While there we took the opportunity to meet with Ministers and government representatives to advocate for South Gippsland's needs. Discussions centred around Council's advocacy priorities which include – amongst others – roads, resilient coastal communities and disaster recovery infrastructure funding. We also lobbied strongly for the Australian government to fund the upgrade and ongoing maintenance of the Yankie Automated Weather Station.

The Deputy Mayor and I were fortunate to be Mary Aldred MPs first visitors at her office in Parliament House and had some very productive conversations. The trip also highlighted the significant progress Council has made in Canberra, with many government representatives acknowledging Council's efforts—particularly regarding coastal strategies and planning. Councillor Gilligan was invited to chair a Coastal Roundtable event during the visit, which was well received and testament to our strong leadership in this area.

Our main takeaway from the visit was that many other local governments are facing similar challenges, and it's important that we continue to engage and collaborate to address them together.
