How Do I Know If I Have Sewer or Septic?

If you don't pay a wastewater charge on your water bill, you **do** have a septic system. If you're a tenant or renter, it's best to confirm with your landlord.

Why Maintenance Matters

Onsite wastewater systems (septic systems) require regular care and maintenance to function effectively. Knowing where your system is located on your property is essential - so that any issues can be identified and resolved quickly.

Failing to maintain your septic system can result in significant financial, environmental, and health impacts.

However, a well-designed, installed, and properly maintained system can last for many years.

Tips to Extend the Life of Your Septic System

- Reduce water usage: Spread out the use of major water-consuming appliances—such as washing machines—throughout the week to prevent system overload.
- Be mindful of what enters the system: Avoid flushing baby wipes, personal hygiene products, grease, oils, or other non-biodegradable materials.
- Protect your effluent field: Keep vehicles, heavy structures, and livestock off the effluent area to

avoid compaction or damage.

Maintain healthy bacteria levels: Use septic-safe, low-sodium cleaning and laundry products, and avoid harsh chemicals like bleach that can harm beneficial bacteria.

Warning Signs of a Failing System

- Bad odours near the tank or effluent field
- · Slow draining sinks, showers, or baths
- · Gurgling sounds in pipes

If you notice any of these signs, your system may need attention.

Service and Compliance

All servicing must be carried out by an authorised service representative. Refer to your Installation Permit for your maintenance obligations specific to your system.
