

Funding for Traffic Study at Nyora

South Gippsland Shire Council is pleased to announce that it will be leading the Nyora Transport Infrastructure and Connectivity Study, following a successful \$100,000 grant application.

Council received the funding through the Victorian Government's Flexible Local Transport Solutions Program.

This project is a current action in the *Council Plan 2025/26*, with \$150,000 of Council's budget also allocated to initiate the process.

This study will help plan for better traffic flow and safer connections in Nyora, ensuring improved access for both locals, visitors and freight operators in and around the growing town.

The funding received through the Flexible Local Transport Solutions Program – which provides resources for small-scale transport projects and feasibility studies to local governments – will allow Council to undertake planning that will determine what future road and transport upgrades could be considered for funding and delivery.

The study will look at practical improvements to the town's transport network, identifying opportunities for road layouts, intersection upgrades and improved pedestrian links. The study will also help support safe freight routes in the area.
