Failure to comply with disclosures of conflict of interest (s.130) may be subject to penalty points and/ or other disciplinary measures depending on the nature of the conflict.

Disclosure of a conflict of interest in respect of a matter to be considered at a Council Meeting is required under section 130(1)(a) and specifically applies to a relevant person being a Councillor, member of a delegated committee who is not a Councillor and a member of Council staff.

Council's Governance Rules (C82) (the Rules), Chapter 5, clause 7, 8 and 9 sets the prescribed manner required for staff to disclose a conflict of interest when:

- Preparing Reports for Meetings
- Exercise of Delegated Power
- Exercise of a Statutory Function

Council staff must immediately upon becoming aware of a conflict of interest provide a written notice to the Chief Executive Officer disclosing the conflict of interest, explain the nature of the conflict and how it will be managed. Upon becoming aware and declaring a conflict of interest, a staff member may not exercise a power or perform a function in the matter. All prepared reports will record that staff member(s) have considered a conflict of interest and include if any, the details of a disclosure.

Failure to comply with disclosures of conflict of interest (s.130) may be subject to penalty points and/ or other disciplinary measures depending on the nature of the conflict.

On the day of the Meeting, questions on the prescribed form must be received prior to the commencement of the Council Meeting by 2.00pm and placed in the receptacle at the Governance Officers table. These questions will be taken on notice, included in the Minutes and responses provided at the next Council Meeting.

Public Question Time in Council Meetings is to be used for matters that are relevant to the business or functions of Council and are clear and legible. Questions may not be allowed where the question(s) is deemed to be:

- Related to a matter beyond or outside the powers of Council;
- Trivial or frivolous;
- Defamatory, indecent, abusive or objectionable;
- Derogatory or designed to embarrass a Councillor, a member of Council staff or a member of the community;
- Related to subject matter previously received and responded to;
- Related to a matter already considered and resolved upon by Council;
- Breach Council's confidentiality obligations; and/or
- Illegible, vague or not make sense.

A person may submit a maximum of three (3) questions for any one Council Meeting, this includes a combined total of three (3) questions for related parties or groups. The total word count of all questions submitted is to be 100 words or fewer.

Background material submitted with a question will not be read out or recorded in the Council Meeting Minutes.

The CEO retains the discretion, in consultation with the Mayor, to not refer questions to Council meetings if there is a more effective or appropriate way to respond to the matters raised. Answers to questions from a member of the community who is present in the gallery will be read out at the Council Meeting by the CEO or Mayor.

4. URGENT BUSINESS

Objective - Leading with Integrity

Council's governance is strengthened by regular organisational performance reporting against the annual actions of the 2025-2029 Council Plan and annual budget.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The purpose of this report is for Council to consider the Organisational Performance Report for the period of 1 July 2025 to 30 September 2025 (Attachment [5.1.1]) which includes the financial and organisational performance against the adopted Annual Budget and highlights progress of the 2025/26 Annual Actions of the 2025-2029 Council Plan (Council Plan).

Council adopted 31 Annual Actions for 2025/26, in which all of these actions are on-track to be completed by 30 June 2026.

RECOMMENDATION

That Council:

- 1. Receives and notes the Organisational Performance Report for the period July 2025 to September 2025 (Attachment [5.1.1]);
- 2. Publishes the Organisational Performance Report (Attachment [5.1.1]) to Council's website: and
- 3. Presents the Organisational Performance Report for the period July 2025 to September 2025 (Attachment [5.1.1]) to the 2 December 2025 Audit and Risk Committee.

REPORT

The role of Council is to provide leadership for the good governance of the Shire. This is achieved, in part, by establishing strategic directions articulated in a four-year Council Plan and supported by an adopted Budget that contains the first (annual) financial year and subsequent three financial years.

These requirements are legislated under s.90 and 94 of the *Local Government Act 2020* (Act).

Council endorsed the 2025/26 Annual Actions as part of the 2025-2029 Council Plan at the 18 June 2025 Council Meeting. The Council Plan outlines three themes which include:

- Leading with Integrity;
- Developing a Sustainable Future; and
- Empowering Communities.

The Council Plan connects these objective themes and outlines Council's priorities, major actions and measure of success indicators for the next four years. These Annual Actions are adopted each year in the Budget and are monitored and reported to Council within each Quarterly Performance Report.

Key Highlights of the Organisational Performance Report

There are 30 actions identified in the Council Plan with all currently on-track to be completed by 30 June 2026.

Highlights from work undertaken to achieve the annual initiatives are below:

- Significant progress made on the review of the Community Engagement Policy and Community Engagement Strategy.
- Extensive review of Council's 2026 Advocacy Priorities (subsequently adopted at October Meeting) and hosted a series of meetings with representatives from both the Victorian and Australian Governments.
- A revision of Council's Road Management Plan 2025 was endorsed at the September 2025 Council Meeting.
- Heritage Review in selected towns and the Planning Scheme have commenced in preparation of project scope and well underway.
- Council implemented actions as part of the Visitor Economy Strategies including;
- Working in partnership with the event organisers of Eat, Drink, Play Gippsland Festival.
- Developed new content for the Visit South Gippsland website including blogs.
- Hosted South East Visitor Information Services Network Group meeting.
- Finalised the installation of the Great Southern Rail Trail wayfinding, interpretative and directional signage.
- Supported local NAIDOC week events in July 2025.

- Continue to support volunteer organisation through Council's community grants program with Round One of the 2025 Community Grants Program which closed 31 August 2025 which received 28 applications, 2025 Small Grants Program which has funded 11 applications and Emergency Grants Program has funded one application.
- Commenced drafting the new Youth Strategy using feedback from February 2024 Youth Forum.
- Continuing to deliver the Live4Life program, adding an additional school to the program, bringing the total number of participating schools in the Live4Life Program to six.
- Commenced review of technology strategy inline with Digital and Technology Roadmap to identify emerging opportunities and impacts, including the use of AI.
- Commenced a review of the Mirboo North, Venus Bay and Foster Community Emergency Management Plans.
- Loch and Tarwin Lower Resilience Plans are in development, led by the community with a focus on energy resilience and energy resilience hubs.
- The following activities were undertaken in the implementation of annual actions from the Arts, Culture and Creative Industry Strategy:
- Artist, Hiroyasu Tsuri (or TWOONE) undertook a mentorship of two young people in the painting of the ArtCubes on site in Leongatha.
- Delivered a talk to 80 people at the Cotierie, Korumburra.
- Ran a workshop for 40 young people at the Community Hub Korumburra.
 The works made at this session were then exhibited first in the ArtCubes,
 and then in a curated exhibition in the Coal Creek Community Park and
 Museum Exhibition Space.
- Doctor Hubble's Bubbles gig at Outtrim Hall was a sell-out show and supported by local folk group, The Stony Six.
- Significantly advanced works to the roof restoration of the heritage train carriages in partnership with the Friends of Coal Creek.

Year to Date Financial Analysis

The adjusted underlying result for 2025/26 is forecast to be a surplus of 6.01 per cent. The adjusted underlying result demonstrates Council's ability to generate a surplus in its ordinary course of business, excluding non-recurrent capital grants, non-monetary asset contributions and other contributions to fund capital works from its net result. A surplus or increasing surplus suggest an improvement in operations. The forecast for 2025/26 is an improvement on the 2024/25 result of

5.85 per cent, primarily due to Disaster Recovery Funding payments received for expenses incurred in a previous year.

Council's proposed forecast Indebtedness Ratio as of 30 June 2026 is 22.54 per cent, and is well within the ratio maximum of 40 per cent or lower.

The movement between Adopted Budget and Approved Forecast is attributed to year-end carry forwards from 2024/25. A detailed mid-year budget review will be undertaken during quarter two and presented to Council with the Quarter 2 Organisational Performance Report.

Capital Works expenditure to 30 September 2025 of \$3.53 million is largely ontrack to the forecast \$4.4 million. This is attributable to projects running on time with limited delays and limited adverse weather conditions.

CONSULTATION / COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

The Organisational Performance Report will be presented to Council's Audit and Risk Committee on 2 December 2025.

RESOURCES / FINANCIAL VIABILITY

The 2025/26 Annual Actions are funded through the 2025/26 Annual Budget.

RISKS

The Organisational Performance Reports ensure the organisation remains in budget and mitigates the risk of annual actions not being monitored throughout the financial year. Inadequate monitoring of their progress may result in activities not within budget, not being achieved, or without understanding the reasons for any delay or budget constraints.



1.1 Management Cash Result Statement

Whilst the Comprehensive Income Statement is prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, it contains several items which are "non-cash" in nature such as depreciation on assets and the written down (book) value of assets sold. It also excludes capital expenditure, new borrowings and loan repayments and as such, does not provide an accurate indication of the surplus/deficit cash position within a financial year. The Statement adjacent provides a management cash result for the period 1 July 2025 to 30 September 2025 which removes non-cash items and adds back cash items that are excluded from the Comprehensive Income Statement.

The Approved Forecast includes the year-end carry forwards from 2024/25 of \$6.628 million, endorsed by Council on 20 August 2025.

As part of regular fiscal oversight, a first quarter budget review has proposed an unfavourable adjustment of \$0.004 million to the management cash result, with changes explained in section 1.2.

User Fees – Unfavourable (\$0.5 million) This variance is due to Environmental Health and Local Laws council fees and charges. This is a timing variance only; the budget will be phased to more accurately reflect the timing of collection for these council fees and charges during Q2. No impact to year end position.





3.1 Financial Ratios

Operating Position


The adjusted underlying result demonstrates Council's ability to generate a surplus in its ordinary course of business, excluding non-recurrent capital grants, non-monetary asset contributions and other contributions to fund capital works from its net result. A surplus or increasing surplus suggest an improvement in the operating position.



The adjusted underlying result for 2025/26 is forecast to be a surplus of 6 per cent.

Liquidity

The Working Capital Ratio, which assesses Council's ability to meet current commitments, is calculated by measuring Council's current assets as a percentage of current liabilities.



Council's proposed forecast as of 30 June 2026 has a Working Capital Ratio of 1.67. The decrease in the forecast compared to previous years is due to a forecasted increase in trust funds and deposits, provisions & unearned rate revenue, as well as a decrease in cash and investments. Forecast of 1.67 remains above the targeted minimum of 1.5.

Section 3 – Year to Date Financial Analysis

3.1 Financial Ratios

Obligations

The Indebtedness Ratio Percentage measures Council's ability to pay the principal and interest on borrowings when they are due from the funds it generates. Own-sourced revenue is used in the calculation, not including any grants or contributions.

Council's proposed forecast Indebtedness Ratio as of 30 June 2026 is 22.54 per cent, and is well within the maximum of 40 per cent or lower.



Asset Renewal

Council aims to ensure that it is able to maintain its infrastructure assets at the expected levels, while at the same time continuing to deliver the services needed by the community. The investment in asset renewal for the 2025/26 year is forecasted to be \$24.1 million.

The Capital Replacement Ratio compares the total rate of spending on new infrastructure, property, plant and equipment with its depreciation. Ratios of higher than 1:1 indicate that spending is faster than the depreciation rate. Council's proposed forecast Capital Replacement Ratio of 1.98 for the year ending 30 June 2026, which is well above the target of 1.5.

The investment in asset renewal for 2025/26 is forecasted to be \$24.1 million resulting in a lower ratio forecast compared to previous year, where renewal expenditure was \$33.0 million in 2024/25 and the average over the previous four years was \$26.5 million per year.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The purpose of this report to Council is to present the Feasibility Study – Venus Bay Saltmarsh Rehabilitation (Attachment [5.2.1]) for consideration. The Venus Bay Saltmarsh Project was a 2023 Advocacy Priority for Council, and is also listed as a proposed action in Council's Coastal Strategy. It involves the potential rehabilitation of 324ha of low lying grazing land, to a natural environment of saltmarsh and mangrove.

In July 2023, Council secured \$80,000 from Department Energy, Environment and Climate Action to develop a Study that investigated the potential rehabilitation, including risks and benefits, with a key focus on:

- Improved coastal resilience.
- Possible nature-based solution for coastal hazard asset protection; protecting transport infrastructure from inundation.
- Environmental risks and benefits.
- Potential for economic benefits through blue carbon crediting.
- Possible ways forward and modelling for rehabilitation.

This study has now been completed and is presented for Council's consideration.

RECOMMENDATION

That Council:

- 1. Endorse the Feasibility Study Venus Bay Saltmarsh Rehabilitation (the Study) (Attachment [5.2.1]) and share a copy of the Study with key stakeholders.
- 2. Send a letter to the Minister for Environment and the Department of Energy, Environment and Climate Action, thanking them for the opportunity

to undertake the work and sharing the outcomes of the Study for their interest.

REPORT

The Venus Bay Saltmarsh Project has been a community advocacy project for many years. The recent production of a Feasibility Study – Venus Bay Saltmarsh Rehabilitation (the Study), used hydrodynamic modelling and assessment to understand the feasibility of restored tidal connections through applying breaches to the existing levee.

Increased coastal resilience is important to this area. The Cape-to-Cape Resilience Project identified coastal flooding of road access as a key hazard that will affect the Venus Bay community.

The Study identifies the following key findings:

- Natural wetland conditions can be formed or 're-habilitated' by activating three breach locations in the existing levee wall, without detrimental impact on coastal flooding.
- The resulting wetland will form a Nature Based Solution that provides significant environmental benefits.
- Implementing wetland rehabilitation does not increase the risk to road infrastructure.
- Supporting adaptations (sub-levee upgrade and Lees Rd levee protection) reduce flood risk to road access from present day conditions.
- This rehabilitation may be able to access blue carbon credits, with associated upfront costs and ongoing management.
- There are costs associated with achieving the rehabilitation and further studies required to minimise risk and undertake due diligence.
- The impact of the proposal on local groundwater resources needs further investigation

With the completion of this study, Council's 2023 Advocacy commitment is also complete. The site is currently privately owned. Encouraging the purchase of this land by the State Government, not for profit and/or private enterprise could be a future advocacy campaign considered by Council and/or the Community. The Study supports any future advocacy for the rehabilitation.

The completion of this study also satisfies the Coastal Strategy Action 2.2. 'Investigate the 'Common Ground' community initiative on the land adjoining Andresons Inlet at Venus Bay that proposes nature-based adaptation concepts that if implemented, will assist in managing storm surge, flooding and coastal erosion'.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The township of Venus Bay is flanked by reclaimed farmland, which was once estuarine floodplains. Rehabilitation of the coastal wetlands has been proposed by the Venus Bay community. Rehabilitation involves the removal of levee sections that currently restrict tidal flow into the area. This project assesses the feasibility of the proposal by assessing the suitability of the area for wetland rehabilitation, the potential for mangrove and saltmarsh vegetation, and how it may impact flooding of nearby road infrastructure.

There are many benefits associated with healthy coastal wetlands. They provide visual and recreational amenity to the community, increase fish productivity, and are resilient to storm tides while naturally adapting to sea level rise (SLR).

Investigations that were undertaken for this project includes an on-ground levee survey and LiDAR ground truthing, defining viable breach locations, desktop vegetation assessment, and detailed modelling. The modelling tested the existing vs wetland rehabilitation scenario for inundation and flooding now and with future sea level rise (SLR). This information was then used to inform supporting adaptation options to mitigate flood impacts and complete a risk assessment for the project, focussing on road access.

The LiDAR and satellite imagery were used to assess the potential of the farmland to form a rehabilitated wetland once tidal flows are established. Vegetation assessment was undertaken to understand the elevations that have the potential to grow mangrove and saltmarsh communities. Mangroves were present below 1.1 metres and saltmarsh existed above that elevation (Table 1-1).

From Figure 1-1, the lower elevation on the farmland side is approximately 0.9 metres, falling within the observed 0.31 to 1.1 metre elevation range of the mangrove area. This suggests that with rehabilitation, the farmland presents promising potential for mangrove recruitment and rehabilitation.




Figure 1-2 Levee breach locations

Levee breach locations were chosen to enable sufficient inundation of the wetland area while managing risks to infrastructure assets due to the levee breaches. The breach areas align with the relict channels within the floodplain (Figure 1-2).




Figure 1-3 Inundation in HAT conditions.

Inundation under HAT conditions is of key importance to wetland rehabilitation. Prior to the simulated levee breaches there is no tidal flow within the rehabilitation area of interest. Once man-made breaches are included, the site experiences inundation within and adjacent to relict channels (Figure 1-3). Indicating that the site would be suitable for wetland rehabilitation.

The flooding of roads was assessed in detail to understand the potential impact of the levee breaches on critical infrastructure. Two sections of road are potentially impacted. Venus Bay Road leading into the first estate crosses the low-lying floodplain as is most vulnerable. Lees Rd between the two estates, located to the fringe of the floodplain at the base of the dunes, is generally less exposed.

To quantify the impact, the values for depth, velocity, and velocity multiplied by depth (VD) were assessed with respect to the safety criteria within the Guidelines for Development in Flood Affected Areas (DELWP, 2019).




Figure 1-4 Floodplain inundation in 1% and 5% ST, comparing existing (no breach) to all breaches with the sub-levee adaption option.

Adding the breaches leads to a marginal increase in flooding, while remaining well below the adopted flood safety thresholds. With upgrade of a sub-levee towards the eastern end of the wetland rehabilitation area, flooding can be minimised, improvements to flooding in both 5% and 1% storm tides can be seen in Figure 1-4.

The modelling and assessment results were used to inform a risk and management assessment for the site in existing conditions (no breaches), all breaches, and all breaches with supporting adaptations (Table 1-3 to Table 1-5).

Summary: Implementing wetland rehabilitation at the site does not increase the risk and management requirements for road infrastructure. The risk assessment indicates that supporting adaptations (sub-levee upgrade and Lees Rd levee protection) reduce flood risk to road access in present-day conditions, this reduction in risk diminishes with SLR of 0.2 m and above.

Project implementation will involve further site investigation, such as vegetation, geotechnical, and groundwater assessments, as well as detailed design. The site also has potential to be registered as a Blue Carbon project and potentially generate carbon credits that can be sold to generate revenue (Carbon Farming Initiative— Tidal Restoration of Blue Carbon Ecosystems) Methodology Determination 2022. This will add additional project requirements such as:

- A modelling and GIS report that shows the restoration area now and into the future to 100 years, incorporating sea level rise and storm tides.
- Design for levee removal and construction of supporting adaptations.
- Environmental Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999 (EPBC) self-assessment report
- Native Vegetation Management Plan
- Land Management Plan
- Acid Sulphate Soils Management Plan
- Mosquito Management Plan
- Ongoing vegetation monitoring for ACCU claims

With further work and planning, the study site provides a good option for wetland rehabilitation without adversely impacting risk to critical coastal infrastructure, namely Venus Bay Road and Lees Road. A rehabilitated wetland would provide benefits to the community, local tourism (bird watching, fishing, day walking), and land managers that are responsible for coastal protection and infrastructure.





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1 INTRODUCTION

The township of Venus Bay is flanked by farmland that was once coastal wetlands and was reclaimed by a system of levees to restrict tidal flow. Rehabilitation of these coastal wetlands has been proposed by the Venus Bay community. The South Gippsland Shire Council (SGSC) is investigating the feasibility of the project. This study underpins that investigation with updated survey, hydrodynamic modelling, and assessment.

Rehabilitation involves the removal of levee sections that currently restrict tidal flow into the area. This project assesses the feasibility of the restored tidal connections for potential mangrove and saltmarsh vegetation, and also any associated impact on the flooding of nearby road infrastructure.

There are many benefits associated with healthy coastal wetlands. They provide ecological and habitat values, visual and recreational amenity to the community and increased fish productivity. They also provide resilience to storm tides in a way that can naturally adapt to sea level rise (SLR).

This increased coastal resilience is an important factor for the area. The Cape-to-Cape Resilience Project (Water Technology, 2022a) identified coastal flooding of road access as a key hazard that will affect the Venus Bay community. The risk assessment conducted as part of those works found the area was exposed to a significant risk with SLR of 0.5 m and above, where short term action is required to treat, eliminate, or reduce risk (DEECA, 2024). The preferred pathway for adaptation starts with nature-based methods, such as wetland rehabilitation – reinforcing the appeal of the proposed restoration of wetlands in this area.

This report will outline the existing data and residual data gaps. Additional investigations that were undertaken for this project are detailed including:

- An on-ground levee survey;
- LiDAR ground truthing;
- Defining viable breach locations;
- Desktop vegetation assessment, and
- Detailed modelling.

The modelling tested the existing case (base case) against a wetland rehabilitation scenario for inundation in highest astronomical tide (HAT) conditions (for increase in intertidal area), and storm tide conditions (for flooding extents), all under different SLR combinations. This information was then used to inform supporting adaptation options to mitigate flood impacts and complete a risk assessment for the project, focussing on road access.





2 BACKGROUND

2.1 Existing data

LiDAR over the study site was captured in 2008 and 2009 at resolution of 1.8 pts /m² with an accuracy of +/-100 mm RMSE (Vicmap Elevation DEM). The LiDAR was processed to a 1 metre grid in 2013, which was the data used in this project. This data was ground-truthed and supplemented along the length of the levee with accurate ground survey for this project.

A 2D hydrodynamic model of Anderson Inlet was developed for the Cape-to-Cape Resilience Project. See Water Technology (2022b) for further details on the model and calibration. The model mesh was updated specifically for this project to capture the levee and relict channels within the study site area.

2.2 Study site

Anderson Inlet is the tide-dominated estuary fed by the Tarwin River and several smaller tidal creeks, most notably Screw Creek and Pound Creek. It serves as a harbour managed by Gippsland Ports and supports both a small commercial fishing industry and several recreational boat ramps. The inlet is recognised as both a coastal reserve and fisheries reserve due to its healthy waterways, abundant fish stocks and easy access for both locals and visitors to the surrounding towns. The main townships along the inlet – Inverloch, Venus Bay and Tarwin Lower – are the primary centres of development, while the remainder of the shoreline consists of forested land and farmland. Much of the farmland occupies former coastal wetlands that were reclaimed in the 1950s to 1960s through the construction of a network of levees.

This study is focussed on a section of reclaimed farmland near Venus Bay (the Study Site). The Study Site lies between the two estates of Venus Bay (as shown in Figure 2-1) and abuts the channels of Anderson Inlet. The levee along the Anderson Inlet edge is the main levee preventing tidal flooding, with a secondary 'sub-levee' running along the eastern end.

2.3 Site conditions

2.3.1 Astronomical tides

Venus Bay and Anderson Inlet experience water level variations associated with **astronomical tides** caused by the gravitational attractions between the Earth, Moon and Sun. Astronomical tides result in relatively high frequency diurnal (daily) and semi-diurnal (twice daily) water level variations that propagate across Bass Strait into Venus Bay and onwards into Anderson Inlet. The astronomical tides undergo further modifications within Anderson Inlet due to interactions with the entrance bathymetry and Inlet shape. Tidal planes (key tidal water levels) within the Study Area are provided in Table 2-1.

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2.3.2 Storm surges

Additional coastal water level variations, also known as the **residual water level**, propagate into the Study Area associated with atmospheric pressure (the inverse barometer effect), wind drag on the ocean surface and the interaction of weather systems and coastal waters, which generate coastally trapped waves.

Storm surge is the common term used to describe the residual associated with the passing of a storm event. Large storm surges in the Study Area are generally associated with the passage of strong cold fronts and associated low pressure systems along the Victorian coast. Within Anderson Inlet strong and consistent winds across the inlet can also cause localised surges due to wind setup.

The combined elevated water level due to the astronomical tide and storm surge is generally referred to as a **storm tide**. This recognises that the highest water levels occur when storm events peak near to the astronomical high tides. Conversely, extreme events that occur at low tide may have a negligible impact.

Storm surges within Venus Bay can peak over 1.0m and the peak annual storm surge is above 0.5m. Peak storm surges measured within Anderson Inlet in 2020 – 2021 were up to 0.5m at Inverloch and Tarwin Lower jetties.

2.3.3 Extreme offshore water levels

The following extreme water level assessment was conducted for the Cape-to-Cape Resilience Project (Water Technology, 2022a).

The present-day storm tide levels are presented in Table 2-2 along with the HAT and MHWS for reference. An indication of the level of uncertainty associated with the predicted storm tide levels has been provided. This uncertainty is the result of the cumulative uncertainty of the analysis and modelling process. Some of the uncertainties relate to the data inputs, whilst others are dependent on the numerical modelling processes itself. Details of the modelling and data that underly these levels can be found in the associated reporting (Water Technology, 2022a).

2.3.4 Wind setup in Anderson Inlet

The action of wind on the water surface creates shear stresses that can drag water in the downwind direction. This occurs offshore in Bass Strait and contributes to the offshore storm surge. It also occurs due to local wind across the shallow and intertidal areas of Anderson Inlet, with additional local increases in water level observed downwind.

Sensitivity testing undertaken for the modelling of coastal inundation hazards within Anderson Inlet, described in (Water Technology, 2022b), shows wind setup within the Inlet can cause increases in water level along the Inlet shorelines of 0.05m to 0.4m under sustained 1% AEP wind conditions. The direction and duration of the wind, as well as the water level within the Inlet has a significant influence on total wind setup levels.





2.3.5 Tarwin River flows

Flooding of low-lying areas between Meeniyan and Tarwin Lower in the Tarwin River catchment are common with road closures typically occurring on at least an annual basis.




Figure 2-2 Flow rate, Tarwin River @ Meeniyan (Gauge 227202)

The Tarwin River has a gauge at Meeniyan, 40km upstream of Tarwin Lower. The gauge provides daily flow data from June 1955 to present. The flow data is presented in Figure 2-2 with the top 10 flow events provided in Table 2-3.

The design flood flows developed for the Anderson Inlet / Lower Tarwin model are shown below in Table 2-4 and have been established through numerical modelling and flood frequency analysis (Water Technology, 2022b). Flood events in 2012 and 2021 have been scaled up to provide representative hydrographs for the 1% AEP and 10% AEP respectively.

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


Figure 2-3 Tarwin River design flood hydrographs

2.4 Road network

The road network in the Study Area, provides a degree of protection to the floodplain from inundation by acting as barriers to overland flow. At several locations along the Inverloch-Venus Bay Road, carriageways are comprised of elevated causeways relative to the surrounding land. The hydraulic connectivity through the causeways is limited to a small number of culverts and/or bridge structures which allow some flow.




Figure 2-4 Inverloch - Venus Bay Road topography and cross section






Figure 2-5 Venus Bay Road cross-section and levee long section used in Figure 2-4 and Figure 4-1.

The causeways provide significant control over coastal inundation and/or catchment flooding and the subsequent drainage of the floodplain. Figure 2-4 highlights the elevation of the Inverloch-Venus Bay Road in relation to the levee and key coastal water levels (cross-section from Figure 2-5).

Conversely, inundation of roads is a major hazard given the constraints on access to key townships. As such, road inundation has been used to assess how wetland remediation works impact vulnerable infrastructure.

3 VEGETATION VIABILITY ASSESSMENT

The LiDAR and satellite imagery were used to assess the potential of the farmland to form a rehabilitated wetland once tidal flows are established. The key criteria for mangrove and saltmarsh suitability is the frequency of saline inundation, which is related to the ground elevation. This study has therefore focussed on identifying ground elevations within the farmland area that match that of the mangrove and saltmarsh communities on the seaward side of the levee.

Vegetation assessment was undertaken to understand the elevations that have the potential to grow mangrove and saltmarsh communities.




Figure 3-1 Elevation profile across levee

Figure 3-1 shows an extracted elevation profile at a location across the levee. The profile spans farmland on one side of the levee, leading into vegetated saltmarsh and mangrove zones on the opposing side. Elevation increases when moving from the mangrove to saltmarsh zones, aligning with the marsh and mangrove tidal range for growth, i.e. mangroves were below 1.1 metres and marsh existed above that elevation (Table 3-1).

Elevation differences between the farmland and vegetated sides of levee were observed at various locations when surveying the levee. From Figure 3-1, the lower elevation on the farmland side is approximately 0.9 metres, falling within the observed 0.31 to 1.1 metre elevation range of the mangrove area. This suggests that with rehabilitation, the farmland presents promising potential for mangrove recruitment and rehabilitation.

The observed mangrove and saltmarsh elevations were remapped onto the existing LiDAR in Figure 3-2. This mapping showed extensive area for mangroves to colonise the existing farmland areas following rehabilitation.

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The reason for this existence of ideal mangrove elevations behind the levee is due to subsidence of ground surfaces.

Figure 3-1 shows evidence of subsidence on the farmland side of the levee, the vertical sinking or settling of the ground surface. Elevation along this extracted profile drops approximately 0.4 metres on the farmland side of the levee.

4 LEVEE SURVEY AND BREACH LOCATIONS

4.1 Coastal levees

Formal and informal embankments, referred to as coastal levees in this study, currently surround approximately 52% of the shoreline of Anderson Inlet. The Venus Bay levee appears in the 1950 historical image. The heights of the coastal levees are generally constructed to 3 – 4 m above the surrounding floodplain, to what was considered to be above the 1934 flood event levels. A 2018 assessment of the levees surrounding Anderson Inlet, found them to be degraded and requiring maintenance to re-establish their original level of protection (Water Technology, 2018). Based on updated survey (Section 4.2), the levee crest now varies in elevation from +1.5 m to +2.7 m AHD. Erosion of the levee crest was evident in and subsidence of the floodplain on the landward side of the levee had occurred.




Figure 4-1 Long section along Venus Bay levee (survey)

Whilst the levees are generally built to a height considered sufficient to provide protection from an extreme storm event under existing mean sea levels, low points in levees will allow overtopping during storm tide events. An example of a levee section is shown in Figure 4-1 (location of section shown in Figure 2-5). The levee dips from 2.5m AHD to below 1.7m AHD, which has a higher than 10% chance of being overtopped each year.

4.2 Levee survey

In order to address potential inaccuracies with the LiDAR survey, an on-ground survey of the levee was conducted on the 13th of December 2024. Key personnel involved in surveying were Michael Miloshis and William Stevenson-Vissers of Water Technology, and Ben Lehmann of the South Gippsland Shire Council.

A Trimble R12 device with correction over the phone network was used to survey ground elevation along the extent of the levee crest. A total of 246 measurements were taken with the Trimble R12. This included 236 ground elevation measurements taken along the levee crest and 10 ground elevation measurements taken on nearby asphalted roads and carparks. The accuracy of the Trimble R12 varies from 10-30 mm.





4.2.1 Ground truthing

To ensure accuracy of the Trimble R12 device in reference to the LiDAR data, 10 measurements were taken in areas of distinct elevation near to the levee. This involved sampling ground elevation along asphalt roads and carpark areas where it is expected that ground elevation recorded by LiDAR is accurately capturing the ground without interference from vegetation or ground undulations. Three (3) areas were sampled and compared to recorded LiDAR data, these locations being asphalted areas on the northern and southern ends of the levee, and an area on Lees Road approximately 700 metres Southwest of the levee.

Table 4-1 shows these measured points in comparison to recorded LiDAR elevation. The statistics in Table 4-2 show that the mean difference of ground truth test data was 0.01 metres, whilst the range of minimum to maximum difference values fell within 0.16 metres of 0. This narrow range of difference suggests that the survey equipment is functioning accurately in reference to the LiDAR data.

4.2.2 Levee elevation analysis




Figure 4-2 Differences between survey and LiDAR ground elevation data at all survey locations.

The ground survey data taken at 236 points along the levee crest was then compared to LiDAR data by taking the difference between measured and recorded elevations, as presented in Figure 4-2. The full dataset can be viewed in Appendix A.




Figure 4-3 Histogram of differences between survey and LiDAR ground elevation data across sampled levee crest locations.

The majority of differences show that the LiDAR is higher than the ground survey (Figure 4-3). This is likely due to the LiDAR tracking the top of dense vegetation rather than the ground.

Table 4-3 shows that the mean difference of measured ground elevation in reference to LiDAR was -0.188 metres, with differences spanning the range from -1.282 to 0.630 metres.

4.2.3 Levee survey summary

As evidenced in Figure 4-3 and Table 4-3, greater differences were observed between surveyed and LiDAR ground elevations along the levee crest in contrast to flat, unobstructed areas (roads and carparks). This suggests that the LiDAR data may be inaccurate in areas where vegetation is dense or there is difficultly in picking up the crest of the levee due to its narrow width. Additional inaccuracies could arise from post-processing of LiDAR point cloud to a 1 metre grid.

These areas of inaccuracy are resolved in the hydrodynamic model with the use of the ground survey data for levee crest elevations.

4.3 Potential levee breach locations




Figure 4-4 Levee breach locations

The location of potential levee breaches is an important factor in the feasibility of the proposed restoration project. Levee breach locations were chosen to enable sufficient inundation of the wetland area while managing risks to infrastructure assets due to the levee breaches. The breach areas align with the relict channels within the floodplain. The size of the breaches are comparable to the existing channels within Anderson Inlet that lead to the given breach location. This minimises the waterway changes in response to a breach, allowing the system to adapt to the change as efficiently as possible, reducing erosion and associated loss of marsh and mangrove vegetation. There are three (3) locations that fit the criteria as shown in Figure 4-4. These were adopted in the modelling scenarios to investigate resultant inundation and current speeds.

5 GROUNDWATER

Where unconfined groundwater exists near the coast a hydraulic connection with sea water exhibits an interface between the less dense freshwater sitting above, and adjacent to, a wedge of salt water. As the salt water is denser than the fresh water it moves in this form beneath the fresh water. This wedge of salt water can occur on the landward side of the coastline and can extend from metres to several kilometres beneath the freshwater system (lvkovic et al, 2012). Mixing occurs between the freshwater and saltwater at the interface of the two, with the position and width of the interface zone depending on the particular hydrogeological and hydrological conditions.

During a tidal cycle the location of the interface can vary depending on the sea level; with the interface moving inland at the high tide and then retreating seaward on the ebb. The result is that on areas such as tidal flats, there can be a layer of saline groundwater beneath the near-shore vegetation communities during the high tide which is displaced by fresh groundwater as the tide retreats. The magnitude of these changes is strongly dependent on the level of hydraulic connection between the aquifer and the sea and the geological properties of the aquifer such as permeability.

5.1.1 Groundwater in the study area

The area from Tarwin Lower to the coastline and the sand spit to Point Smythe is designated as the Tarwin Groundwater Management Area. The groundwater extraction and licensing in this area is regulated by the Southern Rural Water Corporation who consider the groundwater resources in the Tarwin Groundwater Management Area to be finite and at risk if extractions exceed permitted levels.

Aquifers in the Study Area comprise aeolian coastal and inland dune sand sediments deposits.

Drillhole information from monitoring bores at the two Venus Bay settlements indicate silty sand and shell material exists to around -40m AHD where limestone and clay deposits are encountered. Groundwater is thus likely to be unconfined along the coastal interface.

Many bores exist within the study area, the majority of which are for water supply, where groundwater bores are used for non-drinking purposes. Groundwater yields within the Study Area vary between 1 and 10 L/s.

The depth to the groundwater table has been estimated using this bore data and the groundwater is noted to be 5m - 6m below ground level (m bgl). The depth is less than 1m across the low-lying floodplains of the Tarwin River, coinciding with areas likely to be inundated during flood events.

Groundwater flow is generally interpreted to flow towards the ocean, supported by groundwater levels measured within bores located within the Study Area. Over the past 30 years groundwater levels within the Tarwin Groundwater Management Area have displayed relatively stable trends from year to year, with seasonal high groundwater levels at the end of winter and seasonal lows at the end of summer.

5.2 Groundwater impacts

Climate change has the potential to affect groundwater systems through a number of different mechanisms which influence the recharge processes for groundwater system (e.g. changes in rainfall and intensity or temperature and subsequent vegetation changes and so on).

The following key potential hazards are identified:

- Landward migration of the freshwater-saltwater interface
- Permanent surface inundation of low-lying coastal regions and/or increase in the frequency and intensity
 of temporary inundation resulting in intrusion of salt water into freshwater reserves





 The time required for the freshwater-saltwater transition zone to reach a new equilibrium with sea level rise

Over time, sea level rise is generally likely to result in an increase in groundwater levels and salinity near the coastline. Increased salinity may be realised sooner if the levee is breached, allowing for saltwater intrusion to the floodplains adjacent to the Venus Bay aquifer.

Increases in groundwater salinity and quality may result in several existing bores becoming increasingly saline and therefore no longer suitable for their current use. This would ultimately result in the need for affected users to potentially redrill, find a new suitable location, or new supply method to meet their water demands. Additionally, pumps may become damaged, need replacement or upgrading due as a direct consequence of damage caused by the increased salinity of the groundwater.





6 HYDRODYNAMIC MODELLING

Modelling was used to test the impact of breaches in the levee on floodplain inundation and flooding of roads. This allowed for simulated trials of breach number and supporting adaptation options. The exiting model of Anderson Inlet, developed and calibrated for the Cape-to-Cape Resilience Project (Water Technology, 2022a), was refined in the area of interest for this project.

6.1 Modelling methods

The existing model was adapted to address the specific scope of this project. The following section outlines the model similarities and differences to the existing model.

6.1.1 Modelling inundation

The Anderson Inlet 2-dimensional MIKE21 model from the Cape-to-Cape Resilience project was used to simulate the offshore storm tides, design winds and catchment inflows into Anderson Inlet. The model mesh is a flexible mesh, which allows for accurate and efficient capture of complex topography in the mesh. The mesh area in the study site was updated to capture the levee, relict channels, and roads in detail.

Inundation extents and paths have assumed the present-day topography into the future. Morphological processes within the inlet will continually change channel form, and vegetation growth will alter the elevation of the floodplain over time. As a result, this will lead to some over and some underestimates of inundation into the future, although it is very hard to project such changes. This limitation is acceptable for wetland rehabilitation and decadal assessments of risk to infrastructure as is required in this project.

6.1.2 Model calibration

For full model set-up, including calibration and validation see Water Technology (2022b, Appendix E Section 4). Minor changes to the model were made to decrease the resolution over floodplain areas that are not assessed. The Venus Bay levee and wetland rehabilitation area has been included in high detail. Water Technology's model calibration knowledge of shallow tidal floodplain flow has been applied. Namely reduced flooding and drying depths to provide greater model accuracy within the wetland rehabilitation area.

6.1.3 Tidal boundary

Offshore model boundaries include tides (HAT), storm tides and SLR.

- HAT tidal inundation to help define the viability of saltmarsh and mangrove rehabilitation under normal tide conditions and with SLR (potential upsides).
- Storm tide scenarios will assess the impact breaches might cause on coastal flooding of road infrastructure in present-day and future SLR conditions (potential downsides).
- Future sea level rise scenarios have been determined by the Victorian Government Department of Energy, Environment, and Climate Action (DEECA), the managers of Victoria's Resilient Coast (VRC) grants that fund this project. Sea level rise scenarios, and the associated planning horizons are presented below.

Based on the current height of the levee, flows associated with SLR beyond 0.5 m will not be significantly affected by the levee and removal of levee sections and advancement of wetland rehabilitation within the study site.





6.1.4 Modelled inflow -Tarwin River

Given that the location of the wetland rehabilitation area is at the upstream end of the Inlet, the Tarwin River flows will contribute to inundation throughout the study site. The coincidence of storm tides and runoff has been reviewed across Australia as part of the updated Australian Rainfall and Runoff (AR&R P18/S3/011, 2014). The analysis indicated Victoria had the lowest levels of interdependence between storm tide and rainfall across Australia and the coincidence of a 1% and 1% storm tide and flooding event is not appropriate. Some dependence is present however, and as such a 1% to 10% AEP combination is typically adopted for flood studies in Victoria where storm surge is present. This was the recommended approach from the 2000 document Floodplain Management in Australia: Best Practice Principles and Guidelines (Standing Committee on Agriculture and Resource Management (SCARM), 2000).

Design flow events have been generated for the Tarwin River by utilising standard hydrologic and hydraulic processes (Water Technology (2022b, Section 3.4.1).

6.1.5 Model scenarios

Storm tides are combined with design flood events in the Tarwin River for assessment of flooding in Anderson Inlet. The conditions for storm tide, HAT, and Tarwin River inflows are presented in the table below.

Coincidence of events for the different scenarios were reviewed and the combinations of storm tide, flooding and sea level rise established for the project.

The suite of modelled scenarios was developed specifically to assess various storm tides, river flow conditions, and sea level rise as follows:

- Storm tides: 1%, 5%, and 10% AEP, corresponding to 1 in 100-, 1 in 20-, and 1 in 10-year ARI.
- Tarwin River flow: 10% AEP hydrograph (1 in 10-year ARI), and 20 m³s-1 base flow.
- Sea level rise: 0.0 m, 0.2 m, and 0.5 m (corresponding to current day, 2040, and 2070)
- HAT: A tide cycle that reaches the highest tide level without storm influence (1.50 m)

6.2 Modelling results

The main focus of the modelling is to achieve maximum flow into the wetland rehabilitation area, while maintaining or improving coastal hazard risks to key infrastructure (namely Venus Bay Road and Lees Road) with implementation of the sub-levee adaptation option. Therefore, the following model output parameters were assessed:

- Inundation extents HAT, Storm Tides, and SLR.
- Flow velocity at the breach locations





Hazards – Flooding of roads (Venus Bay Rd and Lees Rd) – here, flood duration, depth, and velocity were assessed to provide an indication of the severity of the flood and allow comparison of inundation hazard between the various scenarios.

6.2.1 Inundation extents




Figure 6-1 Inundation in HAT conditions.

Inundation under HAT conditions is of key importance to wetland rehabilitation. Prior to the simulated levee breaches there is no tidal flow within the rehabilitation area of interest. Once man-made breaches are included, the site experiences inundation within and adjacent to relict channels (Figure 6-1). These model outputs, in conjunction with the vegetation analysis in Section 3 indicate that the site could be viable for natural marsh and mangrove rehabilitation.




Figure 6-2 Floodplain inundation in 1% storm tide conditions.

Inundation in 1% storm tide conditions is widespread across the floodplain, extending throughout the study site and over Venus Bay Road into the adjacent floodplain. This occurs with the existing levee (no breaches), while adding a breach in either of the three breach locations results in a marginal increase in inundation to the south-east of the study site (Figure 6-2).




Figure 6-3 Inundation – 0.0 m SLR

Sea Level Rise (SLR) leads to a significant increase in inundation when combined with 1% storm tide conditions. Three SLR scenarios were considered, 0.0 m, 0.2 m, and 0.5 m (Figure 6-3 to Figure 6-5). Beyond 0.5 m of SLR, the removal of levee sections no longer has a material effect on inundation.

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


Figure 6-4 Inundation – 0.2 m SLR




Figure 6-5 Inundation – 0.5 m SLR

6.2.2 Velocity at breach sites

Velocity was assessed at the breach locations to understand how breach designs may impact flow through the structure. HAT flow conditions were assessed at each of the breach sites with a 10-metre-wide channel through the levee.





Simulated peak flow velocity was 1 to 1.4 ms⁻¹. Ultimately, the width of the breach will be constrained by the rock armouring used, and the resulting change to inundation/hazard at the roads. This can be addressed in potential detailed design stages.

Velocity was also assessed at flooded roads to inform the hazard assessment in section 6.2.3, below.

6.2.3 Impact assessment – Modelled flooding of roads

The flooding of roads was assessed in detail to understand the potential impact of the levee breaches on critical infrastructure. Two sections of road are potentially impacted. Venus Bay Road leading into the first estate crosses the low-lying floodplain as is most vulnerable. Lees Rd between the two estates, located to the fringe of the floodplain at the base of the dunes, is generally less exposed.

To quantify the impact, the values for depth, velocity, and velocity multiplied by depth (VD) were assessed with respect to the safety criteria within the Guidelines for Development in Flood Affected Areas (DELWP, 2019). The threshold values were adopted from Table 2 of that document, which relates to access to residential lots. These are:

Depth: 0.3 m
 Velocity: 2.0 ms⁻¹
 Velocity x Depth: 0.3 m²s⁻¹

See Appendix B for a full list of scenarios and results.

6.2.3.1 Existing conditions impact assessment.

Simulation results for 1% storm tides in 0.0 m, 0.2 m and 0.5 m SLR conditions (Figure 6-3 to Figure 6-5), and HAT combined with a 10% river flood are presented in Table 6-3.

Summary: 1% storm tides cause flooding of roads in existing conditions and flood safety exceedances in 0.2 and 0.5 m SLR conditions. There is no flooding of roads during HAT conditions up to 0.5 m SLR.

6.2.3.2 Wetland rehabilitation impact assessment

Simulation results of HAT + 0.0 m and 0.5 m SLR with 10% river flooding (no storm tide), and 1% storm tide + 10 % river flood are presented in Table 6-4.

Summary: No flooding of roads in HAT conditions up to 0.5 m SLR, flooding of roads without flood safety exceedances in 1% storm tide conditions.

Flooding is comparable with or without wetland rehabilitation (existing vs all breaches). There is potential to reduce flooding to roads with upgrades to the existing sub-levee within the rehabilitation area and construction of a small levee at the low point along Lees Rd. The supporting adaptation options are explored in the following section.





7 SUPPORTING ADAPTATION OPTIONS

Wetland rehabilitation is a well-established nature-based solution, providing resilience to sea level rise and storm tide hazards. This option is often supported with additional adaptation activities that aim to reduce any remaining exposure to key infrastructure. This can involve the following options as per Victoria's Marine and Coastal Policy (2020):

- 1. Non-intervention: This involves accepting the current situation and not actively intervening to manage coastal hazards.
- 2. Avoid: This strategy focuses on preventing development or activities in areas vulnerable to coastal hazards. It may involve land-use planning changes to restrict development in high-risk zones.
- 3. Nature-based Solutions: These involve using natural or engineered-natural systems to manage coastal hazards. Examples include restoring or protecting coastal ecosystems like saltmarshes, mangroves, and sand dunes.
- 4. Accommodate: This approach involves adapting to coastal hazards by modifying existing infrastructure or buildings. This could involve raising structures, elevating roads, or implementing water-sensitive urban design.
- 5. Retreat: This strategy involves relocating assets and infrastructure away from vulnerable coastal areas. This can involve land acquisition, buy-backs, or other mechanisms to facilitate relocation.
- 6. Protect: This option involves using hard engineering structures like seawalls, rock revetments, or groynes to protect assets from coastal hazards. This is generally considered the last option after other strategies have been explored.

Upon review of the ground features and survey data, there are two protection options to provide additional resilience to the road infrastructure with the wetland rehabilitation option in place:




Figure 7-1 Sub levee elevation model. Existing (Top), Modified (Bottom).

- 1. The sub-levee towards the eastern end of the study site (see Figure 2-1) was viewed as a good candidate to provide additional resilience by raising its crest level from 1.5-1.7 m AHD to 2.0 m AHD (Figure 7-1). This would allow for rehabilitation of much of the study site, while preventing the additional flow from flooding Venus Bay Road. The model is used to assess the benefits of this option with respect of the existing main levee and the main levee with breaches installed. Ideally, the current inundation risk level is retained or improved by including this additional adaptation option with the nature-based solution of wetland rehabilitation.
- 2. Construction of a small levee at the low point of Lees Rd between the two Venus Bay estates.

The results were then used weigh up the rehabilitation option with respect to coastal hazards.

7.1 Wetland rehabilitation with supporting adaptation impact assessment

Simulation results of 1% storm tide, 10 % river flood in 0.0 m and 0.2 m SLR conditions with all breaches and the sub-levee upgrade to 2.0 m are presented in Table 7-1.




Figure 7-2 Floodplain inundation in 1% and 5% ST, comparing existing (no breach) to all breaches with the sub-levee adaption option.

Summary: There is a reduction in flooding when comparing the "all breach" and existing conditions simulations vs all breach with the sub-levee upgrade. The sub-levee upgrade removes flooding from Venus Bay Road (Figure 7-2 comparing yellow to purple) and creates minor flooding of Lees Road. Flooding of Lees Rd can be managed with a 0.75 m high, 200 m long levee. Implementation of the sub-levee adaptation option partially mitigates flooding in both existing and rehabilitation/breach scenarios (Table 7-2). This demonstrates that levee breaches can be used while reducing hazards to roads.

Overall, there is a reduction in flood impact with the sub-levee adaptation and breaches in place.

8 RISK ASSESSMENT


The coastal hazard risk assessment from the Cape to Cape Resilience Project was applied (DEECA, 2024). This incorporates the detailed modelling assessment of the wetland rehabilitation and coastal flood hazards in Section 6.2.3.

8.1 Coastal hazards

Coastal hazards considered in adaptation planning for the Cape to Cape region include:


Coastal erosion

Including sand/sediment loss on sandy shores, cliff collapse or slumping




Storm tide inundation

Temporary flooding from the sea and rainfall (catchment)



Permanent inundation

Increasing tidal areas due to SLR



Groundwater intrusion

Rising water tables and increased salinity







8.2 Risk assessment

A simplified risk assessment was applied that takes into account the timing of the hazard (related to SLR) and likelihood of the hazard (related to storm tide) (Table 8-1):

8.2.1 Previous risk assessment

Risk and management requirements from the Cape to Cape Resilience Project (DEECA, 2024) are presented in Table 8-3. This is based on the whole of Anderson Inlet model and applies to both Venus Bay and Tarwin Lower. The detailed modelling assessment conducted for this project is focussed on the wetland rehabilitation study site only. Therefore, it is not a direct comparison, but it is helpful to understand how assessed risks and management actions can change with detailed analysis.

8.2.2 Existing risk assessment

Incorporating the detailed modelling and assessment undertaken for this project results in changes to the risk and management requirement for the site in existing conditions (no breaches) (Table 8-4). Erosion risk was removed as it relates to erosion of the sand dunes on the open coast, which is not relevant to this project. The risk to groundwater intrusion was added as it is an important consideration of the wetland rehabilitation project.

Summary: Storm tide risk increases at 0.2 m SLR, permanent inundation risk decreases to Low for 0.0 to 0.5 m SLR. Groundwater risk is Low (levee preventing tidal ingress), rising to medium at 0.5 m SLR where HAT can crest the levee.

8.2.3 Risk assessment with levee breaches

Risk and management requirement with wetland rehabilitation only (all breaches constructed without sub-levee and Lees Rd levee supporting adaptations) (Table 8-5).

Summary: There is a potential increase in risk to groundwater intrusion. The recommended further work outlined in Section 9.1.1 can be used to confirm risk to groundwater intrusion. Risk remains the same for storm tide and permanent inundation.

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8.2.4 Risk assessment with levee breaches and supporting adaptations

Risk and management requirement with wetland rehabilitation (all breaches), sub-levee, and Lees Rd levee supporting adaptations (Table 8-6). Note that the Lees Rd levee was not required to be modelled as it is constructed to a suitable height to stop all flow.

Summary: Risk remains the same for permanent inundation and groundwater intrusion. Present-day risk is reduced to Low for storm tide inundation.

Overall wetland rehabilitation within the study area can be implemented with or without supporting adaptations. The risk assessment indicates that supporting adaptations (sub-levee upgrade and Lees Rd levee protection) reduce flood risk to road access in present-day conditions, this reduction in risk diminishes with SLR of 0.2 m and above.





9 PROJECT IMPLEMENTATION AND BLUE CARBON POTENTIAL

Project implementation requires several tasks. They are listed below with cost estimations.

9.1 Further site investigation

9.1.1 Groundwater investigation

The risk of increased salinity should be investigated and understood before a decision is made on wetland rehabilitation. The following investigations are recommended to ensure an adequate understanding of this risk:

- Field deployment of piezometers (to approximately 1 m underground) and water level loggers (for surface water levels and salinity) within the floodplain area of interest
- Groundwater survey of Venus Bay residences to ascertain groundwater uses and volumes
- Basic groundwater model of the aquifer to calculate recharge and water balance of the aquifer

This will allow for a reasonable understanding of the potential for saltwater intrusion within the groundwater resources in the event wetland rehabilitation, and how this impact may compare to risks associated with rising sea levels.

Cost is estimated between \$40,000 and \$60,000.

9.1.2 Modelling

The study site is well understood, with detailed survey and modelling completed. Further modelling will be required to assess detailed design options of the levee breaches and supporting adaptation options. Cost is estimated between \$20,000 and \$30,000.

9.1.3 Geotechnical assessment

Geotechnical assessment and sediment coring will be required to understand environmental constraints of excavating and placement of levee material and inform design and construction. Cost is estimated between \$30,000 and \$60,000.

9.2 Detailed design

Detailed design of the levee breaches and supporting adaptation options will be required. This will include:

- Updated survey of the levee at the breach sites.
- Dimensions of the breaches, and levee upgrades.
- Concept and detailed designs
- Design drawings
- Construction specification for tender
- Safety and design report

Cost is estimated between \$50,000 to \$100,000 depending on levee breach number and supporting levee upgrades.

9.3 Blue carbon potential

Sites with existing structures that restrict tidal flow may be ideal candidates for restoration through structure removal to reinstate natural tidal flows. Active restoration involving the removal of built structures is a pre-

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requisite of the Blue Carbon credit initiative managed by the Emissions Reduction Fund (ERF). The Blue Carbon Method creates opportunities for landholders to change their management practices to restore wetlands, sequester carbon and earn Australian Carbon Credit Units (ACCUs) for economic benefit (DCCEEW, 2022).

To register a blue carbon project with the Emissions Reduction Fund (ERF), the following documentation is required:

- Documentation that the levees are legal
- A modelling and GIS report that shows the restoration area now and into the future to 100 years, incorporating sea level rise and storm tides. Ties in with further modelling in Section 9.1.2.
- Design for levee removal and construction and supporting adaptations as outlined in Section 9.2.
- Environmental Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999 (EPBC) self-assessment report (\$25,000 to \$50,000). This assumes that no Matters of National Environmental Significance (MNES) are found in the project area.
- Native Vegetation Management Plan (\$25,000 to \$50,000)
- Land Management Plan (\$15,000 to \$30,000)
- Acid Sulphate Soils Management Plan (\$10,000 to \$20,000)
- Mosquito Management Plan (\$5,000 to \$10,000)
- Ongoing vegetation monitoring for ACCU claims Desktop assessments using freely available Sentinel imagery and or drone survey (\$10,000 per year)

9.4 Construction costs

To establish the wetland rehabilitation area, up to 3 breaches may require construction, together with the sublevee upgrade and Lees Rd levee.

In general, levee removal is efficient, and the sourced material may be used to upgrade the sub-levee (subject to contamination testing, etc.).

Costs will vary depending on the materials used/armouring required. This will be finalised during detailed design. Estimated cost TBC.

9.5 Estimated project implementation costs

The summary of project implementation costs is presented in Table 9-1. Ongoing project management costs are presented in Table 9-2.

The costs presented here are estimates of low confidence. Detailed design will consider design options that reduce construction and maintenance costs while balancing risks to existing infrastructure. For instance, adding a section of levee removal either side of the channel to create a more natural floodplain reduces the velocities through the breach and therefore may reduce the scope of construction and ongoing maintenance.

9.6 Blue carbon accounting

The BlueCAM is an approved accounting method based on studies of carbon abatement due to wetland restoration (Lovelock et al, 2021). It considers the existing landscape and the changes to vegetation areas over time, brought about by the restoration activities, such as barrage removal. Carbon sequestration in the soil and vegetation, as well as carbon emissions avoidance, are considered.

A starting point of Grazing Land was chosen. Approximated land-type changes at five-year intervals were applied as per Table 9-3.

The end of reporting period 1 (five years after the levees are breached) 100% of the area is estimated to be sparsely vegetated salt flats. Final areas (25 years after the levees are breached) are estimated to be 40% mangrove, 50% marsh, and 10% sparsely vegetated wetlands.





The calculated ACCUs are using a baseline of "Grazing land". When mapped in detail, there may be a significant amount of "Tidally restricted fresh and brackish wetlands", and "Flooded agricultural land, managed wet meadow or pasture", which will increase the ACCU generation potential by up to 10-fold for those areas. The generated ACCUs and the potential revenue when converting the area from "Grazing land", "Tidally restricted fresh and brackish wetlands" or "Flooded agricultural land, managed wet meadow or pasture" to a rehabilitated marsh and mangrove wetland is presented in Table 9-4.

The ACCU price is based on the following:

ACCU spot price - \$35.50 (Core Markets, June 2025)

It is likely that the study site contains several vegetation/land management classes. This can be resolved with a vegetation assessment to improve the revenue estimate above.





10 RECOMMENDATIONS

The following provides a summary of the recommendations for levee removal to rehabilitate the wetland without increasing coastal hazard risk to infrastructure.

All three breach locations can be activated to create tidal conditions that closely resemble the pre-levee form of the wetland without detrimental impact to coastal flooding. The resulting wetland will form a nature based solution to increase resilience of the area to storm tides and SLR, while improving the environmental and visual amenity for Venus Bay. An upgrade to the sub-levee is recommended to support the project and reduce flood risks to Venus Bay Rd. A small levee (approximately 200 m x 1.0 m) at the low point of Lees Rd is also recommended to prevent minor flooding during 1% storm tide conditions.

Further work is required for project implementation as outlined in Section 9.

11 SUMMARY

The vegetation assessment indicates that the site can readily rehabilitate hydrological connections that are likely suitable for mangrove and marsh communities. This in turn may provide a good candidate for a registered Blue Carbon project that can earn ACCU credits to support ongoing management of the wetland.

The on-ground levee survey and updated modelling was essential to provide the detail required for this assessment.

The study site provides a good option for wetland rehabilitation without adversely impacting risk to critical coastal infrastructure, namely Venus Bay Road and Lees Road. Risk can be reduced with easily implemented supporting adaptation options, upgrading the sub-levee to 2 m AHD crest elevation and construction of a 1.0 m levee along a 200 m section of Lees Rd.

Further work is recommended. A groundwater study is recommended to confirm the risk to groundwater for the Venus Bay community resource. The components of a Blue Carbon Project will include detailed design of the levee breaches, vegetation assessment, hydraulic assessment, land management plan etc, all of which would likely be required by regulators without Blue Carbon registration.

A rehabilitated wetland would provide benefits to the community, local tourism (bird watching, fishing, day walking), and land managers that are responsible for coastal protection and infrastructure.

The Korumburra Tennis Clubrooms Project supports Council's objective of supporting a healthy, connected and inclusive community by providing renewed recreation facilities that meet modern standards and support participation in tennis for people of all ages, genders and abilities.

Use of external funding to support the renewal of the existing tennis pavilion aligns with Council's strategy to maintain our assets through responsible financial management.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The purpose of this report is for Council to consider the approval to award Contract CON/424 for the Construction of the Korumburra Tennis Clubrooms Project.

At the February 2025 Meeting, Council endorsed an application to the Victorian Government's Regional Community Sports Infrastructure Fund for a \$1M contribution to the estimated \$1.5M Project. This application was successful, and the Korumburra Tennis Clubrooms has been readied to commence this financial year 2025/26.

Tenders for the majority of the Project scope have been sought via Request for Tender RFT/424 – Construction of the Korumburra Tennis Clubrooms and the evaluation panel have determined a recommended tenderer for award of the Contract. However, based on the Contract value, the Project is unable to be completed within the \$1.5M budget and requires an increase in Council's financial contribution of up to \$350,000 to successfully deliver the Project.

RECOMMENDATION

That Council:

- 1. Approves the award of Contract CON/424 Construction of the Korumburra Tennis Clubrooms to Tenderer B for the lump sum amount of \$X,XXX,XXX (excluding GST);
- Delegates the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) the power to approve variations up to the contingency amount identified in Confidential Attachment [10.1.1];

- 3. Authorises the Chief Executive Officer to sign the contract documents;
- 4. Approves an increase to the Budget for the Korumburra Tennis Clubrooms Project from \$1.5M to \$1.85M by increasing Council's financial contribution to the project from \$475,000 to \$825,000; and
- 5. The additional Budget of \$350,000 could be sourced through savings in the 2025/26 Capital Works Program.

REPORT

The existing Korumburra Tennis Clubrooms have reached the end of their serviceable life. They were opened in approximately 1960, making them 65 years old.

At the February 2025 Meeting, Council endorsed an application to the Victorian Government's Regional Community Sports Infrastructure Fund for a \$1M contribution to the estimated \$1.5M Project. This application was successful, and the Korumburra Tennis Clubrooms has been readied to commence this financial year 2025/26.

Tenders for the majority of the Project scope have been sought via Request for Tender RFT/424 – Construction of the Korumburra Tennis Clubrooms.

The works within Contract CON/424 propose to cover everything required for the construction of the Tennis Clubrooms building, inclusive of all on site civil works, retaining walls and surrounding hard landscape works.

The project also includes new lighting to the lower courts, which are intended to be procured separately.

Contract Details

The details and nature of the contract are summarised below:

Request for Tender RFT/424 was advertised in The Age (9 August 2025) and in Council's Noticeboard section of the local papers (12 August 2025). Tenders closed on 9 September 2025.

In response to Council's RFT/424, a total of ten tender submissions were received. The submitted tenders were assessed in accordance with the criteria specified in the tender documentation by the evaluation panel. From this assessment, the evaluation panel has recommended that Council approves the award of Contract CON/424 to Tenderer B for the lump sum of \$X,XXX,XXX (excluding GST) for the reasons outlined further in this report and based on the Tender Evaluation detailed in **Confidential Attachment [10.1.1]**.

However, based on the Contract value, the Project is unable to be completed within the \$1.5M budget and requires an increase of up to \$350,000 to successfully deliver the Project.

OPTIONS

Option 1 – Council approve the award of Contract and increase contribution to the Project by \$350,000 (Recommended)

It is likely that the only way for the Project to successfully proceed is for Council to contribute additional funding.

As the Project is set to be delivered over two financial years, the additional contribution could be planned for inclusion in the 2026/27 Annual Budget.

Option 2 - Do not proceed with the Project

Abandoning the Clubrooms Project will require a breach of the funding agreement with Sport and Recreation Victoria and the return of any received funds to them. It is possible that this option would cause reputational damage to Council with the funder, tennis club and the community.

Breach of the funding agreement could impact success of future funding applications with Sport and Recreation Victoria.

Due to the age and condition of the existing building, it will need to be replaced or removed by Council in the medium-term. Replacement would likely cost more if pursued at a later date.

Option 3 – Seek to obtain additional funding for the Project

It is considered unlikely that Council would be able to obtain additional external funding for this project. There are no known funding sources available that would be suitable for covering the budget shortfall, and Sport and Recreation Victoria have confirmed that they are unable to increase their contribution to the Project.

Option 4 - Seek to reduce the Project scope to fit the current budget

The Project team have sought ways to reduce Project costs and will continue to seek out savings during the Project's construction. However, it is still considered highly unlikely that the Project could be delivered within the original \$1.5 million budget. Reducing the Project scope is unlikely to be supported by Sport and Recreation Victoria as the Project was funded on a competitive basis and there are minimum requirements that must be met.

CONSULTATION / COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

The Korumburra Tennis Club and Sport and Recreation Victoria have been consulted throughout the planning and design of the Korumburra Tennis Clubrooms Project. As joint funders for the Project, both parties would have representatives on the Project Working Group during the project delivery phase.

RESOURCES / FINANCIAL VIABILITY

Contract CON/424 is set to be delivered from cost centre 82700 – Building Renewal Program – Recreation/Sport - 14930 - Korumburra Tennis Club, which

has a current budget of \$1,500,000 spread over the 2025/2026 and 2026/2027 financial years. There is not sufficient budget to complete all of the Project works, therefore a request for additional budget of \$350,000 is needed, bringing the total required budget to \$1,850,000.

The initial budget amount of \$1,500,000 was based on the cost plans developed by a qualified Quantity Surveyor. However, upon investigation following the receipt of tenders, it appears that the cost plan was deficient, particularly in the areas of Building Services (Electrical and Mechanical).

REPORT

The Local Government Act 2020 (the Act), Part 3, Division 2, outlines the requirements governing Council procedures and proceedings. In accordance with the Act, the conduct of Council Meetings must be prescribed within Council's Governance Rules.

Council adopted its *Governance Rules* at the Meeting held on 19 October 2022. Clause 11 of these Rules requires Council to determine the dates and times of its Meetings. Specifically, Clause 11.1 provides that:

"At or before the last Meeting each calendar year, Council must fix the date, time and place of all Council meetings and any Delegated Committee Meetings for the following calendar year."

In addition, Clause 13.1 provides that Council may, by resolution, call an additional Council Meeting if required outside of the adopted annual Meeting Schedule.

2026 Council Meeting Dates and Venues

Council's Governance Rules require that the date, time and place of all Council Meetings and any delegated Committee Meetings for the following calendar year be determined at or before the final Council Meeting of each calendar year.

It is proposed that the first Council Meeting for 2026 be held on Wednesday 18 February 2026, with subsequent Meetings generally scheduled for the third Wednesday of each month.

Two exceptions of this schedule are proposed:

- 1. In November 2026, two Council Meetings are proposed.
 - a. The first on Wednesday, 18 November 2026 at 2.00PM will be convened for the election of the Mayor and Deputy Mayor, in accordance with Section 26 of the *Local Government Act 2020*. This section prescribes that the Mayoral election must be held on a day determined by Council as close as reasonably practicable to the end of the current one- or two-year Mayoral term.
 - b. The second on Wednesday, 25 November 2026 at 2.00pm will be held to conduct the ordinary business of Council.
- 2. In December 2026, the Council Meeting will be held on the second Wednesday, 9 December 2026 at 2:00pm.

Council Meetings are to commence at 2.00pm and be held in the Council Chambers, Leongatha, unless otherwise determined.

The Chief Executive Officer may, in accordance with Clause 12.1 of the *Governance Rules*, change the date, time or venue of a scheduled Meeting if required. This may include relocating the Meeting to another town where

warranted, by the nature of business or availability of the Council Chambers, Leongatha.

Notice of all Council Meetings is provided to the community via publication in the Noticeboard section of local newspapers and on Council's website.

The Act defines **confidential information in** s.3(1)(a)-(I), and includes information that may prejudice or impact; commercial negotiations, the security of Council, land use planning, law enforcement, legal privilege, personal information, private commercial information, confidential meeting information, internal arbitration, Councillor conduct panel information and information specified under s.77 of the previous *Local Government Act 1989*.

Once confidential information has been considered and decided in a closed session of a Council Meeting, a further resolution to resume open Council is required.
